Tenders will not be accepted for more than Rupees 40,00,000, on the first Wednesday in each month, and power is reserved to issue Bills for any smaller amount than Rupees 70,00,000 in any one month, and to carry over the difference to the succeeding months.

No Tender is to be for a sum less than Rupees 10,000, and one-eighth of a penny per Rupee is to be the smallest fraction tendered.
