only of the parish of Stoke-upon-Trent, in the said county of Stafford, which is surrounded partly by the boundary of the said parish of Newcastleunder-Lyme, and partly by the boundary of the township of Knutton, in the parish of Wolstanton, in the said county of Stafford; and that certain Orders in Council have been issued directing that burials be discontinued in the churchyard of St. John's Church, Hanley, in the said parish of Stoke-upon-Trent, and with certain modifications in the churchyards of St. Giles. and St. George's, both in the parish of Newcastle-under-Lyme; and representing that there is difficulty and inconvenience in providing, under the powers and provisions of the said last-mentioned Act, the requisite places of burial for the inhabitants of the said parishes of Newcastle-under-Lyme and Stokeupon-Trent; and praying that powers may be vested in the said Town Council for providing such place or places of burial, under the provisions of the various Acts of Parliament relating to burials, as shall be deemed requisite for the inhabitants of the said parishes of Newcastle-under-Lyme and Stoke-upon-Trent.

And whereas notice of such petition, and of the time when Her Majesty was pleased to order the same to be taken into consideration by Her Privy Council, has been duly published as required by the said first-recited Act; and it appears to Her Majesty in Council that there is difficulty and inconvenience in providing, under the above-mentioned Act, passed in the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty's reign, requisite places of burial for the inhabitants of the said parishes of Newcastle-under-Lyme and Stokeupon-Trent.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that powers be vested in the Town Council of the borough of Newcastleunder-Lyme for providing requisite places of burial for the inhabitants of the said parishes of Newcastle-under-Lyme and Stoke-upon-Trent, under the provisions of the said Acts.
