

and of all payments made, or to be made thereout; and the creditors at the said meeting will, in pursuance of the said section, declare whether any and what dividend shall be made, and whether any and what allowance shall be paid to the bankrupt. Proofs of debts will be received, and creditors who have not proved, or do not then prove, will be excluded the benefit of the dividend; and all claims not proved will be disallowed.
