MY LORD,
BARON BRUNNOW has communicated to me a despatch from Prince Gortchakoff, dated August 26, September 7, in reply to my despatch to your Excellency, No. 178, of the 11th ultimo, of which you were instructed to give a copy to his Excellency.

Her Majesty's Government have no wish to prolong the correspondence on the subject of Poland for the mere purpose of controversy.

Her Majesty's Government receive with satisfaction the assurance that the Emperor of Russia continues to be animated with intentions of benevolence towards Poland, and of conciliation in respect to all Foreign Powers.

Her Majesty's Government acknowledge that the relations of Russia towards European Powers, are regulated by Public Law. But the Emperor of Russia has special obligations in regard to Poland.

Her Majesty's Government have in the despatch of the 11th of August, and preceding despatches, shown that, in regard to this particular question, the rights of Poland are contained in the same instrument which constitutes the Emperor of Russia, King of Poland.

"The Blackheath Highway District—consisting of the following parishes and places in the said county, which separately maintain their own high-ways: Albury, Alfold, Bramley, Cranley, Dunsfold, Ewhurst, Hascomb, such part of Shalford as is not within the borough of Guildford, Shere, St. Martha, and Womersh.

"The Guildford Highway District—consisting of the following parishes and places in the said county, which separately maintain their own high-ways: That part of Artington which is without the borough of Guildford, Clandon East, Clandon West, Horsley East, Horsley West, Mero, Ockham, Pirbright, Send and Ripley, that part of Stoke which is without the borough of Guildford, Wisley, Woking, and Worplesdon.

"The Godalming Highway District—consisting of the following parishes and places in the said county, which separately maintain their own high-ways: Chiddingfold, Compton, that portion of Godalming parish which lies without the limits of the borough of Godalming, Hambledon, Haslemere, Peper Harrow, Puttenham, Thursley, Wanborough, and Witley.

And notice is hereby further given, that the confirmation of the said Provisional Order, by a Final Order, will be taken into consideration by the Justices of the Peace at the Court of General Quarter Session, to be holden at St. Mary, Newington, in and for the said county of Surrey, on Tuesday, the 5th day of January next ensuing.
