

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1858.

NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ACT BY BEDFORD,

NAVAL PRIZE MONEY.

Department of the Accountant-General of the Navy, Admiralty, Somerset-House, October 30, 1863.

NOTICE is hereby given to all persons interested therein, that preparations are now being made for the intended distribution of the naval portion of the booty, captured in Pegu in 1852 and 1853, and that the officers and crews of Her Majesty's ships stated below, are entitled to participate therein:—"Bittern," "Cleopatra," "Contest," "Fox," "Hastings," "Hermes," "Rattler," "Salamander," "Spartan," "Sphinx," "Styx," "Serpent," and "Winchester."

Agents or other persons having any just and legal demand, unliquidated, against the said proceeds, are required to transmit the particulars of any such demand to the Registrar of the High Court of Admiralty, in order that the same may be examined, taxed, and allowed by that Officer, and paid under the sanction of the Judge of the said Court.

Agents and all other persons holding powers of attorney, prize orders, assignments, or other instruments, by virtue of which they may be legally entitled to claim the share belonging to any captor, are requested, with as little delay as possible, to transmit the same, accompanied by the usual documents, to the Prize Branch of the Department of the "Accountant-General of the Navy, Admiralty, Somerset-House."

Due notice will be given, by future advertisements in the London Gazette, of the date proposed for the commencement of distribution; and, at the same time, the amount of an individual's share in the respective classes will be announced.

"At the General Quarter Session of the Peace, holden at Kingston-upon-Thames, in and for the county of Surrey, on Tuesday, the 20th day of October, 1863:—

"Whereas, in compliance with the provisions of the Act 25 and 26 Vict., c. 61, the Right Honorable Algernon George Percy, commonly Lord Lovaine, M.P., Robert Alfred Cloyne Godwin-Austen, Duncan Macdonald, George Best, and Pitcairn Onslow, Esquires, five of the Justices of the Peace in and for the said county of Surrey, have, by writing under their hands, bearing date the 30th day of last September, required the Clerk of the Peace of and for the said county, to add to or send with the notice required by law, to be given of the holding of this present Court of General Quarter Session, a notice that at this present Court a proposal would be made to the Justices of the Peace here assembled, to divide the whole of the said county, except those portions thereof which are under the Metropolis Local Management Act, or within the Kingston Highway District, into the following Highway Districts, for the purposes of the Highway Acts.

"The Chertsey Highway District—consisting of the following parishes and places in the said county, which separately maintain their own highways: Bisley, Byfleet, Chertsey, Chobham, Egham, Horsell, Pyrford, Thorpe, Weybridge, and Windlesham.
