"And it is hereby further Provisionally ordered, that the said several districts be, and they hereby are, respectively so provisionally constituted, named, and added to accordingly.

"And it is hereby further Provisionally ordered, that each of the said several parishes and places, except the parishes of Barnes, Mortlake, Merton, and Wimbledon, shall respectively elect the same number of Waywardens, under the said first-mentioned Act, as it is now entitled to elect Guardians of the Poor. And it is hereby lastly Provisionally ordered, that each of the several parishes of Barnes, Mortlake, Merton, and Wimbledon shall respectively elect one Waywarden, under the said Act.

"Finally it is hereby ordered, that the Court of General Quarter Session, to be holden at St. Mary,

Newington, in and for the said county of Surrey, on Tuesday, the 5th day of January now next ensuing, being a subsequent Court of General Quarter Session, to be held within a period of not more than six months from the time of holding this present Court, be, and the same is hereby appointed for the taking into consideration the confirmation of the above-mentioned Provisional Order by a Final Order."

And notice is hereby further given, that the confirmation of the said Provisional Order, by a Final Order, will be taken into consideration by the Justices of the Peace at the Court of General Quarter Session, to be holden at St. Mary, Newington, in and for the said county of Surrey, on Tuesday, the 5th day of January next ensuing.
