Flashing Light at Monach Isles.

The Commissioners of Northern Lighthouses have given notice, that on and after the 1st day of February, 1864, a light will be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on Shillay islet, the most western of the Monach group, off the west coast of North Uist, Outer Hebrides.

The light will be a *flashing white* light, seen from around the horizon, and showing a *flash* every ten seconds. The light will be placed at an elevation of 150 feet above the level of high water springs, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 17 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses of the first order.

The tower is 133 feet high, from base to vane, and stands in lat. 57° 31' 34" N., long. 7° 41' 38" W. of Greenwich, at about 33 miles S.S. E. $\frac{3}{4}$ E. from the south point of St. Kilda.

(All bearings are Magnetic. Variation 28° 30' West in 1863.)
