LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1858.

ATHERTON, LANCASHIRE.

WHEREAS the Local Government Act, 1858, has been adopted by the township of Atherton, in the county of Lancaster, and notice of such adoption was duly given and certified, and also published and circulated in the aforesaid township, and copies of such notice have been affixed to the principal doors of each church and chapel in such township to which notices are usually affixed: And whereas an appeal was presented to me, setting forth grounds on which the petitioners from parts of such townships prayed to be excluded from such township, and annexed to the adjoining district of Tyldesley with Shakerley; and inquiry has been directed and made into the circumstances of the case, and into the matters alleged in such appeal, and report has been made to me thereon:

Now, therefore, I, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, do hereby order that the aforesaid appeal be dismissed, and do declare the vote adopting the Local Government Act, 1858, within the aforesaid township of Atherton to be valid; and do also order that the said Local Government Act, 1858, shall come into force within such township of Atherton, from and after the 1st day of January, 1864.
