

Whitchall, Aug. 26. 1687.

WHEREAS His Majesty has been informed by the Merchants owners of the Diamonds Robb'd out of the Holland Mail on the 25th of June last past, Lettgen Colchester and Hawich, that two of the Persons concerned in the said Robbery, have lately been discovered and apprehended at Paris, with whom there was taken part of the Diamonds; And the said Merchants having humbly besought His Majesty, that (Forasmuch as the greatest part of the Diamonds are yet missing) His Majesty would be Graciously pleas'd to renew his Promise of a Pardon to the rest of the Persons concerned in the said Robbery, Provided, and in case they rest w their share of the said Diamonds within thirty days; His Majesty has been pleas'd to Grant the said Merchants Request, And does accordingly hereby Declare and Promise, that in case either, or all the rest of the Persons that have been concerned in the Robbery abovemention'd, do within the space of 30 days, from the Date hereof, return to the Owners that part of the Diamonds which he or they had for their shares, His Majesty will Grant unto the Person or Persons so restoring his or their share of the said Diamonds, His Gracious Pardon for the said Robbery; As also for robbing the Coachs at the same time; besides a Reward of Ten per Cent. of the value of the Diamonds that shall be restored, which the Merchants will pay upon the delivery thereof

get back again returned empty the rest being cut off, or taken Prisoners; which hath report, that their Magazine of Reserve which they had so considered in, was at an open'd, and it was no less a great Store these being particular; but a small quantity in it of Bis Montgat is now surrounded with 5 Forts, and yet Tech-er persuaded 300 Hussars to attempt the Relief of it, by carry each of them a Sack of Meal behind him on his Horse: They pass'd a good way undiscov'rd, but at last being seen by one of our Parties as they cross'd a little Plain to get from one Wood to another, when they were not far from the Town they Rid up to them, but the Hussars immediately discharging themselves of their Burthen, made themselves as light as they could for an Escape, some dividing one way, and some another; those that made toward the Town were chiefly pursued by the Imperialists, who followed them till they were expos'd to shot from the walls; and the few that are got in are like to be of much use to them, since it is certain they want Provisions more than Men. We are told that the Christian Garilons of St. Job and Brzeg, had made a Party to surprize the Town of Sclatz at the time of a publick Fair, which was executed by 600 Hussars; they were soon Masters of the place, killing some few that made Resistance at first; they brought away as much Booty as they could charge themselves with, besides 36 of the most substantial Inhabitants who were most able to pay for their Liberty, for which they are already offer'd about 2000 Livres. We hear from the side of Alba Regalis, that a Letter had been intercepted written from the Bissa commanding there, to the Grand Visier, to give him an account of the present State of that place, which was, That he neither wanted Men nor Victuals, but his Men began to want Cloaths, and he Money to supply them; which they now took upon them with some Importunity to demand, as also their Pay, and he could not answer whether they would be much longer contented with us both.

Vienna, Sept. 18. Here arriv'd this Week a Courier from the Duke of Lorraine with Letters of the 7th Instant, by which we understand, that the Army continued about Erdendi, opposite to the Mouth of the Drave, till the end of the last Month: And it having been well consider'd how unseasonable and violent the Weather was, which was alone sufficient to worst an Army, as was but too visible in the ill Effects it had both upon Men and Horses; And that besides the Visier was much stronger than it was thought he could have been, who had with him at Peter Waradin about 20000 Spaniards, and 4000 Janissaries, therefore, upon the whole, it was judg'd more adviseable, to carry off clear that Advantage and Reputation that had been already got, than to lessen, or fully it, by exposing the Army to a second Affront in Sclawo, and return to Baja, where the Duke of Lorraine was on the 7th Instant, intending to march the next day to Segeden, which would take them up six days to get thither, and then they would have need enough of some Repose, having contested with many difficulties of ill weather, bad ways, and a desert Country without wood, besides a constant alarm in the Rear, there having been 2000 Turkish Horse sent to attend the Army all along their march, who very much increased their fatigue, and have something lessened their number; and so returned again over their Bridge at Peter Waradin. We know nothing of General Durnwald more than that he is pass'd the Drave; there is a Courier lately sent him from hence with Orders (as is suppos'd) to retire, and put his Troops into Quarters.

IN Pursuance of His Majesties Resolution to send a Squadron of Ships into the West Indies under the Command of Sir Robert Holmes, For the suppressing of the Pirats either by Force or Assurance of Pardon, Orders are already given in that behalf; And His Majesty hath been further pleas'd to issue out His Royal Declaration directed to Sir Robert Holmes as His Majesties Sole Commissioner in that Affair, Promising and Declaring, That in Case any such Pirats or Privateers shall within Twelve Months either in Person or by their Agents surrender or become oblig'd to surrender themselves to Sir Robert Holmes, or any others appointed by him, and shall give sufficient Security to be approved of by the said Sir Robert Holmes of their future good Behaviour, His Majesty will be reipm grant in t such Pirats or Privateers, Privateer or Privateers, a full Pardon for all Piracies or Robberies committed by them either upon Sea or Land, before the Date of the said Declaration.
