THE Queen has been pleased to appoint the Lady Augusta Frederica Elizabeth Stanley to be Extra Bedchamber Woman to Her Majesty.

Whitehall, December 19, 1863.

The Queen has been pleased to grant unto Frederick Charles George FitzClarence, of Wingerworth-hall, in the county of Derby, Esquire, commonly called the Honourable Frederick Charles George FitzClarence, sometime a Captain in the 10th (The Prince of Wales's Own) Royal Regiment of Hussars, and to Adelaide Augusta Wilhelmina FitzClarence, his wife, commonly called the Honourable Adelaide Augusta Wilhelmina Fitz Clarence, eldest daughter of Philip Charles Lord De L'Isle and Dudley, and grand-daughter of Sir John Shelley Sidney, late of Penshurst, in the county of Kent, Baronet, and of Henrietta Frances, his wife, daughter of Sir Henry Hunloke, late of Wingerworth-hall aforesaid, Baronet, deceased: Her Royal licence and authority that they may, in compliance with a proviso contained in the last will and testament of Sir Henry John Joseph Hunloke, late of Wingerworth - hall aforesaid, Baronet, deceased, take and henceforth use the surname of Hunloke only, in lieu and instead of that of FitzClarence; that he, the said Frederick Charles George FitzClarence, may bear the arms of Hunloke quarterly with the arms of Fitz-Clarence; that she, the said Adelaide Augusta Wilhelmina FitzClarence, may bear the arms of Hunloke quarterly with her family arms, and that such surname of Hunloke only, and the arms of Hunloke quarterly with those of FitzClarence, may be taken, borne, and used by their issue; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms and recorded in the Herald's Office, otherwise the said Royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect:

And to command that the said Royal concession and declaration be registered in Her Majesty's College of Arms.
