And whereas notice was duly given by the Clerk of the Peace that the confirmation of the said amended Provisional Order, by a Final Order, would be taken into consideration by the Justices assembled at the present Court of Quarter Sessions: Now, therefore, after due consideration, it is ordered that the said amended Provisional Order be confirmed, by a Final Order, and the same is hereby finally confirmed accordingly:—And it is ordered that the first meeting of the Highway Board for the said district shall be held at the Town Hall, in Witney, in the said district, on Thursday, the 7th day of April next, at twelve o'clock at noon (such day not being more than seven days after the first election of Waywardens in pursuance of the said Statute).
