Extension of Western Mole at Genoa.

INFORMATION has been received at the Admiralty, that in consequence of the works now in progress for extending the outer or western mole at Genoa, it is dangerous for vessels to pass close to the extremity of the mole.

Vessels approaching the port of Genoa during day, should keep to the eastward of the large buoy, which is placed off the end of the mole, at about 40 yards from that part at present above water.

If entering the port by night, vessels should keep at least three-quarters of a cable eastward of the light on the western mole, as owing to the unfinished state of the works, that light is at present 100 yards from its extremity.

(No. 6.) MEDITERRANEAN.—SOUTH COAST OF SPAIN.

Fixed Light at Marbella.

THE Minister of Marine at Madrid has given notice, that on and after the 15th day of March, 1864, a light will be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected at Marbella, in the province of Malaga, on the south coast of Spain.

The light will be a *fixed* white light, placed at an elevation of 55 feet above the mean level of

the sea, and should be seen in clear-weather from a distance of 12 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the fifth order.

The tower is slightly conical, 36 feet high, coloured light grey, and surmounted by a green lantern. It is attached to the keeper's dwelling, and stands about a cable westward of the town, at 65 yards from the sea, in lat. $36^{\circ} 31' N.$, long. $4^{\circ} 54' 16''$ West of Greenwich.

Fixed Light at Velez-Malaga.

Also, that on and after the 15th day of March, 1864, a light will be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected at Velez-Málaga, on the south coast of Spain.

The light will be a *fixed* white light, at an elevation of 41 feet above the mean level of the sea, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of 11 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the fifth order.

The tower is slightly conical, 36 feet high, coloured light grey, with a green lantern. It is attached to the keeper's dwelling, stands on the east side of entrance to the Rio Velez-Málaga, at 48 yards from the sea, and said to be in lat. $36^{\circ} 44' N.$, long. $4^{\circ} 9' 16''$ west of Greenwich, or about half a mile south of that of the Admiralty Charts.

BALEARES ISLANDS.

Fixed and Flashing Light on Puercos Islet.

Also, that on and after the 15th day of March, 1864, a light will be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on Puercos Islet, at the north end of Espalmador, south of Iviza.

The light is a *fixed* white light, varied by a *red flash* every three minutes. It is placed at an elevation of 94 feet above the level of the sea, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of 15 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the fourth order.

The tower is slightly conical, 84 feet high, of a dark grey colour, and rises from the middle of the keeper's dwelling. It stands on the north-west part of the Islet, at 40 yards from the sea, and said to be in lat. $38^{\circ} 48' N.$, long. $1^{\circ} 29' 24''$ East of Greenwich, or about 3' east of that of the Admiralty Charts.

This light and that of Ahorcadas, northward of it, marks the principal channel between the Islands of Iviza and Formentera.

The light will be a *fixed* white light, at an elevation of 223 feet above the mean level of the sea, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of 15 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the third order.

The tower is slightly conical, 33 feet high, coloured light blue, and surmounted by a white lantern. It stands north of the keeper's dwelling, about 4 yards from the sea, in lat. 43° 25' 15" N., long. 4° 34' 16" West of Greenwich.
