And it was lastly provisionally ordered, that each of the several parishes of Barnes, Mortlake, Merton, and Wimbledon should respectively elect one Waywarden under the said Act.

"And whereas it was further ordered at the Court of General Quarter Session above-mentioned, that the Court of General Quarter Session, to be holden at Saint Mary, Newington, in and for the said county of Surrey, on Tuesday, the 5th day of January then next ensuing, being a subsequent Court of General Quarter Session, to be held within a period of not more than six months from the time of holding the Court, at Kingston-upon-Thames, as above-mentioned, should be and the same was thereby appointed for the taking into consideration the confirmation of the above-mentioned Provisional Order by a Final Order."
