EARL RUSSELL, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has received a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Marseilles, reporting that the Prefect of the Department of the Bouches du Rhone has issued a Decree closing the Cemetery of St. Charles at Marseilles, from the 1st of June, 1865.

The following is a translation of the Decree in question, the text of which will be found in the "Semaphore" of Marseilles, of the 24th of December last:

[Translation.]

ART. 1.—The Cemetery of St. Charles at Marseilles shall be closed on the 1st of June, 1865, and from that date there shall be no burials therein.

ART. 2.—The Municipal Authorities will see whether it is better to form a new Cemetery in place of the one closed, or make all the burials in the Cemetery of St. Pierre; but these arrangements must be made before the date fixed for the closing of the Cemetery of St. Charles.

ART. 3.—The Mayor of Marseilles and the Central Commissioner of Police are charged, as far as they are concerned, with the execution of the present Decree.
