NOTIFICATION OF BLOCKADE.

IT is hereby notified that, on the 7th instant, Earl Russell, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, received from the Danish Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary at the Court of St. James's the announcement, that the Port of Neustadt will, from the 5th of this month (March), be blockaded by the Danish Naval Forces, together with the other ports and inlets on the east coast of the Duchies of Sleswig and Holstein, mentioned in his (the said Danish Minister's) note of February 26th last, and notice of which was given in the (Supplemental) London Gazette of Monday, the 29th February last.

The following is the official communication received by Earl Russell:—

Legation of Denmark, Mr Lord, London, March 7, 1864.

I AM directed by my Government to inform your Excellency, that the port of Neustadt will, from the 5th of this month, be blockaded, together with the other ports and inlets on the east coast of the Duchies of Slesvig and Holstein, mentioned in my note of February 26th last.
