LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1858.

HOOLE, CHESHIRE.

WHEREAS notice, in writing, was duly given to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, that the Local Government Act,

1858, has been adopted by the township of Hoole in the county of Chester; and whereas appeal has been duly made to me, under the provisions of the said Act, by owners and ratepayers within the said township, against the said vote of adoption, and praying that certain portions of such township should be excluded from the operation of the said Act. And whereas inquiry has been duly directed by me into the circumstances of the case, and such inquiry has been made, and the result thereof reported to me. Now, therefore, I, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State as aforesaid, do hereby, under the provisions of the said Act, issue the following Order, and do determine the questions arising on such appeal as follows:—

That though the population of the said township of Hoole is less than 3,000 according to the last census, yet, from special circumstances, it is expedient that the Local Government Act, 1858, should be adopted by so much of the aforesaid township as is comprised within the following boundaries, viz., the boundary of the said Local Government Act district on the north to be the township boundary as far as the point where it meets the lane leading to Upton, opposite Hoole Hall, thence along the east side of the said lane, southward, to its junction with the Chester and Frodsham turnpike-road, thence along the north side of the said turnpike-road for a distance of 80 yards, thence crossing the said turnpike-road to Hoole Hall plantation, thence along the east side of the said plantation to and including the stables and outbuildings (excepting the barn) connected with Hoole Hall, and thence in a straight line to the point where the township boundary meets the high road leading to Guilden Sutton, thence following the said township boundary in a southerly and westerly direction to Flooker's Brook, thus completing the boundary.

And I do hereby further order, that the Local Government Act, 1858, do come into force within the hereinbefore described portion of the township of Hoole, from and after the 28th day of March, 1864.
