South Staffordshire Water.

(Alteration of Work in the Parishes of Saint Chad, Lichfield, and Longdon, in Staffordshire.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that it is intended in the Bill now pending in Parliament, under the name or short title of "The South Staffordshire Water Bill," to seek power to make an alteration in the situation of the works in the townships of Curborough and Elmhurst, in the parish of St. Chad, Lichfield, and in the parish of Longdon, in the county of Stafford, as shown on the plans deposited in respect of the said Bill in the month of November last. Such alteration of works will be wholly within the limits of lateral deviation delineated on the said deposited plans.
