## NOTIFICATION OF BLOCKADE.

**I**T is hereby notified, that Earl Russell, K.G., Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has received a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at Copenhagen, stating that a Notification from the Ministry of Marine, dated the 22nd instant, appeared in the Official paper of the 23rd instant, stating that the Island of Fehmern is declared in a state of Blockade.

The Queen has been pleased to approve of Mr. Winston J. Trowbridge as Consul at Barbadoes for the United States of America.

**WHEREAS** it appears to me, the Right Honourable Sir George Grey, Bart., one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, that the use of Locomotives, unless restricted as hereinafter mentioned, on or along the Roads within the North and South Districts of Turnpike Roads under "The Cambridge and Ely Roads Act, 1852," is dangerous and inconvenient to the public :

I do hereby, by virtue of the provisions of "The Locomotive Act, 1861," by this Order, under my hand, prohibit the use of any kind of Locomotive whatever, propelled by steam, or any other than animal power, on the above roads, except between the hours of twelve o'clock at night and six o'clock in the morning.

**NOTICE TO MARINERS.**

(No. 12.)—MEDITERRANEAN.

*Fixed and Flashing Light at Patras.*

INFORMATION has been received at the Admiralty, that a new apparatus has been placed in the lighthouse, at the mole head, at Patras.

The light is now a *fixed* white light, varied by a *flash* every two minutes. It is placed at an elevation of about 55 feet above the mean level of the sea; and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of 7 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the fifth order.

**ARCHIPELAGO—SAMOS ISLAND.**

*Fixed Light at Port Tigani.*

The Turkish Government has given notice, that on and after the 31st day of January, 1864, a light would be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on Fonia or Possidon point, at the east side of entrance to Port Tigani, on the south coast of Samos island.

The light is a *fixed* white light, placed at an elevation of 72 feet above the mean level of the sea, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of 6 miles.

The tower is said to stand in lat. 37° 41' N., long. 26° 56' 39" East of Greenwich, or about half-a-mile south, and 2' west of that of the Admiralty Charts.
