NOTICE TO MARINERS. (No. 23.)—MEDITERRANEAN—EAST COAST OF SICILY.

Fixed Light on Massa Point, Syracuse.

THE Minister of Marine at Turin has given notice, that on and after the 15th day of June, 1864, a light will be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on Massa point, at the south side of entrance to the harbour of Syracuse.

The light will be a fixed white light, at an elevation of 125 feet above the mean level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a

distance of 3 miles.

The tower is white, 46 feet high, and stands on a quadrangular base, S.S.E. 2 E., distant 71 cables from the lighthouse in the fort at the opposite side of the entrance to the harbour. The lat. is 37° 2′ 20" N., long. 15° 16′ 21" East of Greenwich.

Also, that on and after the 15th day of June, 1864, a fixed red light will be substituted for the present harbour light at the extremity of the mole at Catania. The light will be at an elevation of 22 feet above the sea, and should be visible at a distance of 2 miles.

## Bell Buoy on Cavallara Shoal.

Also, that on and after the 1st day of June, 1864, a Bell buoy will be placed on the Cavallara shoal, at about 24 cables from Cape Posilipo, at the western side of the Gulf of Naples. Vessels should give the buoy a good berth, to avoid also the shoals of Gajola.
