(No. 27.)—GULF OF TARTARY—COAST OF SAGHALIN.

Fixed Light near Dui.

THE Imperial Ministry of Marine at St. Petersburg has given notice, that a light is exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on the slope of a steep hill between Dui and Cape Otsisi on the north and Cape Hoidji on the south, on the coast of Saghalin, in the Gulf of Tartary.

The light is a *fixed* white light, visible from seaward when bearing from N.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E. round by east to S. by W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. It is placed at an elevation of 373 feet above the mean level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 22 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is catoptric or by reflectors.

The tower is square, 40 feet high, white, and surmounted by a gray lantern. The lat. and long. is not given.

A reef extends N.N.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. distant nearly 6 cables from Cape Hoidji, it is steep to on the north-west and south, but from the westward the soundings decrease gradually.
