THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Note from the Russian Ambassador at this Court, enclosing a copy of a Decree of the Imperial Government to the following effect :

1. All merchant vessels masted and foreigngoing as well as those without masts and coasters, entering the port of Cronstadt, shall pay a special duty, to go to the municipal revenues of that town, for cleaning and the removal of their impurities.

This duty will be levied as follows :-

- For vessels masted and foreign-going, 50 copees per mast.
- For vessels without masts and coasters, 10 copecs the vessel.

2. The arrangements for the cleaning of the vessels, as well as for the collection of the duties to which they are subject, are made according to the General Order in force, by the Municipal authorities of Cronstadt, either by lease in public auction or by trust (en regie), as may be judged convenient.
