**NOTIFICATION of the Raising of the Blockade
of the German Ports in the Baltic, &c.**

IT is hereby notified that Earl Russell, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has received from Her Majesty's Minister at Copenhagen (Sir A. Paget), a telegram, stating that the Blockades of Ports in the Baltic are to be raised during the suspension of arms which has been concluded between Denmark and the German Powers.

The following is a copy of the telegram above referred to :

*“ Copenhagen, July 20th, 10 P.M.
R. 20th, 10 A.M.*

“ A Military Convention was signed yesterday, at Christianfeld, establishing a suspension of arms, to commence at noon to-morrow, 20th, and cease on 31st, at midnight. All Blockades given up. Armies and Fleets to keep their respective positions. No communication allowed between the territories occupied by respective armies.”
