THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade, have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, the following translation of a Portuguese law respecting the coinage of that realm, and of the Azores, which has been received from Her Majesty's Minister at Lisbon:—

ART. 1st.—The Government is authorised to extend until the 31st of December, 1864, the several periods, as prescribed in the 8th Article and its respective paragraphs of the law of July 29th, 1854, for the exchange and currency of the gold and silver coins which were ordered to be withdrawn from circulation by that law.

ART. 2nd.—The Government is likewise authorised to order the coinage of a sum not exceeding 200,000,000 reis (£44,444) in silver, and also a special coinage in copper for the Islands of the Azores, of a sum not exceeding 30,000,000 reis (£6,666), as may be considered most expedient during the term laid down in the 1st Article of this law.

ART. 3rd.—The advantages accorded to private individuals, to Banks and Companies, in virtue of the 2nd Article of the law of April 24th, 1856, are also extended for a further period until the 31st of December, 1864,

ART. 4th.—All legislation to the contrary is hereby revoked.

We command, therefore, all the authorities, whom the knowledge and execution of this law may concern, to keep it, and to comply with it, and to cause it to be complied with and kept precisely as is contained herein.

The Minister and Secretary of State for the Finance Department shall have it printed, published, and circulated.
