NOTIFICATION of the Raising of the Danish Blockade of the Prussian Ports in the Baltic, and of all Ports and Harbours on the Coasts of Sleswig and Holstein.

It is hereby notified that Earl Russell, K.G., Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has received from Her Majesty's Minister at Copenhagen, an official notification (published by the Danish Ministry of Marine), of the raising of the Blockade of the Prussian Ports in the Baltic, and also of all Ports on the Coasts of Sleswig and Holstein, from the 20th July instant.

The following is a copy of the said official notification above referred to:—

THE Ministry of Marine notifies herewith, that, according to the concluded suspension of hostilities, the Blockade of the Prussian ports Colberg, Cammin, Swinemünde, Wolgast, Greifswalde, Stralsund, Barth, Danzig, and Pillau, as also of all ports of Holstein and Slesvig, will be raised from the 20th instant, at noon.
