

from Hailey-lane past the eastern and northern sides of Hailey Bury College into the turnpike road leading from Hertford to London; and extending thence south-westward, and in a direct line to a point in the middle of the said occupation road; and extending thence westward along the middle of the same road (passing to the north of Hailey Bury College aforesaid) to the junction of such road with the said turnpike road leading from Hertford to London; and extending thence, first south-eastward, then southward, and then again south-eastward, along the middle of the same turnpike road as far as a point opposite to the middle of the north-eastern end of a certain occupation road leading from such turnpike road to Box Wood; and extending thence south-westward to a point (in the middle of the north-eastern end of the said occupation road) upon the boundary dividing the said parish of Great Amwell from the consolidated chapelry district of Hoddesdon, in the same county and diocese; and extending thence, first north-westward, and then south-westward, along the last-described boundary to its junction (in the middle of Elbow-lane, near to the homestead called or known as the Keeper's House) with the boundary dividing the said parish of Great Amwell from the parish of Saint John Hertford aforesaid; and extending thence northward along the last-described boundary (which follows at first the middle, and afterwards the western side of the said lane) to the junction of the same boundary with the boundary dividing the liberty of Little Amwell aforesaid from the said parish of Saint John, Hertford, such point of junction being situate at or near to the junction of Elbow-lane aforesaid with the turnpike road leading from Hertford to London before mentioned; and continuing thence, still northward, along the last-described boundary (following the western side of the said turnpike road) to the point at which such boundary turns north-eastward across such turnpike road; and extending thence north-eastward along the same boundary as far as the middle of the same turnpike road; and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the same turnpike road, as far as a point opposite to the middle of the south-western end of a certain occupation road connecting such turnpike road with Gallows-lane; and extending thence, first eastward and then north-eastward, to and along the middle of the said occupation road, as far as a point upon the boundary dividing a certain detached portion of the said parish of Great Amwell from the parish of Saint John, Hertford, aforesaid; and extending thence, first northward (crossing Gallows-lane aforesaid), and then north-eastward along the last-described boundary to its junction with the boundary dividing the same detached portion of the said parish of Great Amwell from the liberty of Little Amwell aforesaid; and extending thence south-eastward along the last-described boundary as far as a point in the middle of Gallows-lane aforesaid; and extending thence eastward along the middle of the last-named lane to a point opposite to the middle of the south-western end of the road called Walnut Tree Walk aforesaid; and extending thence north-eastward to and along the middle of the last-named road, as far as the point upon the boundary dividing the said liberty of Little Amwell from the parish of Great Amwell aforesaid, where the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said

representation, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Rochester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five; duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twelfth day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, in the words following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty, chapter seventy; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five; have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of All Saints, situate at Rhodes, in the parish of Middleton, in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Manchester.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said parish of Middleton, and of the parish of Prestwich, in the county and diocese aforesaid, which lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population, which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such respective parishes.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that such contiguous portions of the said parishes of Middleton and Prestwich should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said church of All Saints, situate at Rhodes aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consents of the Right Reverend James Prince, Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester, of William Wagstaff, of Rhûg, near Corwen, in the county of Merioneth, Esquire, the patron of the rectory of the said parish of Middleton, and of the Right Honorable Thomas, Earl of Wilton, the patron of the rectory of the said parish of Prestwich (in testimony whereof they have respectively signed and sealed this representation), we humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said parish of Middleton, and of the said parish of Prestwich, which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one consolidated
