

said parish of Isleworth (testified by their having affixed their common or capitular seal to this representation), we humbly represent that in our opinion it would be expedient that, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this representation, the boundaries of the said consolidated chapelry or new parish of Hounslow, should be altered so as to dis sever therefrom all that portion thereof which is described in the schedule hereunder written, and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed, and is thereon coloured green; and which heretofore formed part of the said parish of Heston; and that all the said portion of the consolidated chapelry or new parish of Hounslow aforesaid, so to be dis severed therefrom as last proposed, should be re-annexed to and should again form part of the said parish of Heston.

"And we humbly pray, that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto, as to your Majesty, in your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"Territory proposed to be re-annexed to the parish of Heston, being:—

"So much of that portion of the consolidated chapelry or new parish of Hounslow, in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London, which was heretofore part of the parish of Heston, in the same county and diocese as lies to the west of an imaginary line, commencing at a point in the middle of the high road leading from Staines to London, opposite to the middle of the southern end of Wellington-lane, and extending thence northward to and along the middle of such lane, as far as the boundary which at present divides the said consolidated chapelry or new parish from the said parish of Heston, at a point opposite to the middle of the eastern end of the road known as the 'sixth private road' or Green-lane."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of London.

WHERÉAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen; and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and twenty-four; duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the ninth

day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty four, in the words and figures following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen; and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and twenty-four; have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme for making better provision for the cure of souls in certain parishes and districts.

"We humbly recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, out of the common fund in the said Acts mentioned, in each and every year, to the incumbent for the time being of each of the benefices described in the first schedule hereunto annexed, the annual sum set opposite to the name of each such benefice in the last column of the same schedule, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of May and the first day of November in each year.

"Provided always, that the grants so recommended to be made by us to the benefices of Saint Stephen Spitalfields, Holy Trinity Stockton-on-Tees, and East Stoke with Syerston and Elston, shall be paid only upon the production to us, on or before the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year, of certificates under the hand of the Bishops of the respective dioceses, that a curate duly licensed by such Bishop has in each instance been employed within the parish or district during the preceding half year; and provided also, that with regard to the payment of a portion, amounting to one hundred pounds, of the grant so recommended to be made by us to the benefice of Yetminster with Chetnole, a like certificate be required that a curate has been duly employed at Chetnole.

"And we further recommend and propose that the tithes, or rent charges in lieu of tithes, described in the second schedule hereunto annexed, arising out of or upon lands situate within the parish of Llanarmon yn Yâl, in the counties of Denbigh and Flint and diocese of Saint Asaph, with their appurtenances, formerly belonging to the sinecure rectory of Llanarmon yn Yâl, and now vested in us, and all our estate and interest therein, shall, without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, be transferred to and become absolutely vested in the vicar or incumbent for the time being of the vicarage of the said parish of Llanarmon yn Yâl.

"And we further recommend and propose, with the consent of the Reverend John Owen, Clerk, the perpetual curate or incumbent of the perpetual curacy of Erryrys, in the said counties of Denbigh and Flint and diocese of Saint Asaph, testified by his having signed and sealed this scheme, that the tithes, or rent charges in lieu of tithes, described in the third schedule hereunto annexed, arising out of or upon lands situate within the said parish of Llanarmon yn Yâl, with their appurtenances, formerly belonging to the said sinecure rectory of Llanarmon yn Yâl, and now vested in us, shall, in like manner and by the authority aforesaid, be transferred to and become absolutely vested in the perpetual curate or incumbent for the time being of the said perpetual curacy of Erryrys, in lieu of and in full substitution for and discharge of the annual sum or stipend of one hundred and fifty pounds now payable by us to the same perpetual curate or incumbent, under the provisions of an Order of your Majesty in Council bearing date
