**T**HE Secretary of State for War has received Despatches, with their enclosures, from Lieutenant-General Sir Duncan Cameron, K.C.B., Commanding Her Majesty's Forces in New Zealand, of which the following are copies :—

*Head Quarters,  
Auckland, August 2, 1864.*

MY LORD,

I HAVE the honour to report, that in accordance with the intention expressed in my Despatch to your Lordship of 7th June, I have not undertaken any active operations against the rebels during the past month.

I have, however, the satisfaction of informing your Lordship that on the 25th July, 133 natives of Tauranga, including some chiefs of rank, delivered up their arms to Colonel Greer, Commanding at that Station, and signed a declaration of allegiance to the Queen, leaving their lands at the disposal of the Governor.

His Excellency has requested me to accompany him to Tauranga, where he has been solicited by the natives to meet them and arrange the terms of their submission. It is expected that W. Thompson and other chiefs will also be present, in which case it is possible that other tribes, besides those of Tauranga, may be included in the arrangement. I fear, however, that from the want of adhesion among the many tribes composing the native population, it is scarcely to be expected that the meeting about to take place at Tauranga will lead to a general pacification of the country.

I herewith enclose Colonel Greer's report of his proceedings, and I beg to bring to your Lordship's favourable notice the great zeal, judgment, and ability displayed by that officer whilst in command of the troops at Tauranga.

SIR,

I HAVE the honour to report, for the information of the Lieutenant-General Commanding, that

133 native warriors, amongst whom were many chiefs of rank, came into camp and laid down their arms to-day.

Previous to their coming in, Mr. Rice explained to them that their land was to be at the disposal of the Governor and the General; and before I accepted their submission and took their arms, each man signed a document, which was read over twice to them, stating that he clearly understood that fact, and also a declaration of loyalty to the Queen.

All Tauranga has now submitted, with the exception of two chiefs, who have, perhaps, from ten to twenty followers between them.

I have permitted the natives to remain in the village of Oitamoite, and at Maungatapo, pending further instructions; and they are naturally most anxious for some speedy settlement relative to their land.

I beg to bring to notice the tact and ability of Mr. Rice in conducting the matter to which this letter alludes, which he carried through satisfactorily, notwithstanding the opposition and obstruction of Mr. Mackay, Commissioner of the Thames District (whom I have been obliged to confine to the neighbourhood of his tent), and Mr. Baker, Interpreter, without compromising the position of the Government or our arms, and at the same time gaining the esteem and goodwill of the natives.

I inclose lists of the arms delivered, of the names and tribes of the natives who have surrendered, and a copy of the document which they signed, also an account of the proceedings, and of the speeches of the natives when they delivered up their arms, which has been furnished to me by the Interpreter, Mr. Baker; but as his translation gives a very different meaning in some instances from that which was conveyed to me by Mr. Shepherd (Interpreter from Taupo), who acted as Interpreter when the natives were speaking, I have requested the Lord Bishop of Waiapo, who was present and took notes, to give me a translation, to which he kindly assented.

MY LORD, August 6, 1864.

I HAVE the honour to report that the meeting referred to in my despatch, between his Excellency the Governor and the natives of Tauranga, has passed off most satisfactorily, the natives having submitted unconditionally to the Queen's authority, and placed all their lands at the Governor's disposal.

I herewith enclose the terms of peace which were granted to them, and with which they all expressed themselves perfectly satisfied.

Hostilities are now at an end in this part of the colony, and there is reason to hope that the liberal terms accorded to the natives of Tauranga may induce other tribes to make their submissions.

*SIR GEORGE GREY'S Address to the hostile natives of Tauranga, on 6th August, 1864.*

AT present I am not acquainted with the boundaries or extent of your lands, or with the claims of individuals or tribes. What I shall therefore do is this: I shall order that settlements shall at once be assigned to you as far as possible in such localities as you may select, which shall be secured by Crown Grants to yourselves and your children. When this has been done and the boundaries of your lands have been ascertained, I will inform you in what manner the residue of your lands will be dealt with; but as it is right in some measure to mark our sense of the honourable manner in which you conducted hostilities, neither robbing nor murdering, but respecting the wounded, I promise you that in the ultimate settlement of your lands, the amount taken shall not exceed one-fourth of the whole land. And in order that you may, without delay, again be placed in a position which will enable you to maintain yourselves, as soon as your future location has been decided, seed potatoes and the means of settling on your lands will be given you.

I now speak to the friendly natives. I thank you warmly for your good conduct under circumstances of great difficulty. I will consider in what manner you shall be rewarded for your fidelity. In the meantime in any arrangements which may be made about the lands of your tribe, your rights will be scrupulously respected.

(No. 51.)—MEDITERRANEAN—SPAIN, SOUTH COAST.

*Fixed Light on Verde Island, Algeciras.*

THE Minister of Marine at Madrid has given notice, that on and after the 1st day of October, 1864, a light would be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on Verde Island, near Algeciras, Gibraltar bay.

The light is a *fixed* white light, at an elevation of 62 feet above the mean level of the sea, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of nine miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the sixth order.

The tower is 30 feet high, and stands on the south part of the fort on Verde Island, in lat. 36° 7' 19" N., long. 5° 26' 8" West of Greenwich.

**PORT ALFAQUES.***Fixed Red Light at San Carlos de la Rápita.*

Also, that on and after the 1st day of November, 1864, a light will be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected near San Carlos de la Rápita, Port Alfaques, in the province of Tarragona.

The light will be a *fixed red* light, at an elevation of 30 feet above the mean level of the sea, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of six miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the sixth order.

The tower is round, built of stone, retains its natural colour, 22 feet high, and surmounted by a dark-coloured lantern. It stands on Senieta Point, at the distance of 8 cables south-west of the town of San Carlos de la Rápita, in lat 40° 36' 45" N., long. 0° 34' 44" East of Greenwich.

This light with the bell buoy lying 6½ cables south-west of Galacho Point, will assist vessels in entering Port Alfaques at night.

**PORT FANGAL.***Fixed Light on Fango Point.*

Also, that on and after the 1st day of November, 1864, a light will be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on Fango Point, the north part of Alfaques de Tortosa, and east point of entrance to Port Fangal.

The light will be a *fixed* white light, at an elevation of 25 feet above the mean level of the sea, and visible eight miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the sixth order.

The tower is 22 feet high, round, painted a light colour, and surmounted by a green lantern. It rises from the middle of the keeper's dwelling, in lat. 40° 47' N., long. 0° 47' 14" East of Greenwich, and nine miles N.W. ¼ N. from Cape Tortosa lighthouse. Fango Point is low, and shallow water extends some distance off it; vessels in rounding it should give the lighthouse a berth of a mile.

(No. 52.)—MEDITERRANEAN—SOUTH COAST OF SPAIN.

*Revolving Light on Cape Tortosa.*

THE Minister of Marine at Madrid has given notice, that on and after the 1st day of November, 1864, a light would be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on Cape Tortosa, Buda Island, at the mouth of the River Ebro.

The light is a *revolving* white light, attaining its greatest brilliancy every *minute*. It is placed at an elevation of 174 feet above the mean level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen at a distance of 20 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the second order.

The tower is of iron, 169 feet high, round, and painted a light colour. It stands on the eastern extremity of Buda Island, in lat. 40° 43' 24" N., long. 0° 57' East of Greenwich.

The breakers on the bar of the Ebro extend south-eastward 4½ cables from the lighthouse, which is the limit of the depth of 3½ fathoms. Vessels passing the lighthouse in a heavy sea should give it a berth of at least a mile.

The present light, a little to the southward, will be discontinued.

*Fixed Light on Baña Point.*

Also, that on and after the 1st day of November, 1864, a light will be exhibited from a lighthouse

recently erected on Baña Point, the south extreme of the Alfaques de Tortosa.

The light will be a *fixed* white light, at an elevation of 62 feet above the mean level of the sea, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of 13 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the third order.

The tower is of iron, 61 feet high, slightly conical, yellow, and surmounted by a dark-coloured lantern. It rises from the middle of the keeper's dwelling on the low salient point, at 3 miles south-eastward of the entrance to the port of Alfaques, at about 10 yards from the sea, in lat. 40° 34' 30" N., long. 0° 39' 5" East of Greenwich.

Vessels entering or leaving Port Alfaques at night, should give Baña light a berth of at least half a mile. At the distance of 6½ cables from Galacho Point, on the east side of entrance to the port, is a Bell buoy, 2 cables from the shore, which should be left to the eastward.
