The great enlargement of the Table is owing partly to a greater number of voyages having been given at many ports (in conformity with the representations of the Northern Commissioners on the previous edition), and partly by showing deviations through the Inner Sounds, &c., on the west coast of Scotland, now opened to navigators by the new lights shown therein.

The lights building have been stated, and references placed all through the Tables to show where

they will become due.
