THE Queen has been pleased to grant unto the Reverend Ernest Hawkins, B.D., the place and dignity of a Canon in the Collegiate Church of St. Peter, Westminster, void by the resignation of the Reverend William Harry Edward Bentinck.

Whitehall, November 8, 1864.

The Queen has been pleased to give and grant unto Alexander William Thorold Grant, of Weelsby House, in the parish of Clee, in the county of Lincoln, Esquire, Her Royal licence and authority that he may, in compliance with a direction contained in the last will and testament of his uncle Richard Thorold, of Weelsby House aforesaid, Esquire, deceased, take and henceforth use the surname of Thorold, in addition to and after that of Grant, and also bear the arms of Thorold quarterly with those of Grant, and that such surname and arms may in like manner be taken, borne, and used by his issue; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms and recorded in the College of Arms, otherwise the said Royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect:

And also to command that the said Royal concession and declaration be recorded in Her Majesty's said College of Arms.

WHEREAS it appears to me, the Right Honourable Sir George Grey, Baronet, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, that the use of Locomotives unless restricted as hereinafter mentioned, on or along the highways within the borough of Yeovil, is dangerous and inconvenient to the public.

I do hereby, by virtue of the provisions of "The Locomotive Act, 1861," by this Order, under my hand, prohibit the use of any kind of Locomotive whatever, propelled by steam, or any other than animal power, on the above roads, except between the hours of twelve o'clock at night and six o'clock in the morning.
