AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 26th day of November, 1864.

HER Majesty having been pleased to appoint the Right Honourable Beilby Richard, Lord Wenlock, to be Her Majesty's Lieutenant of the East Riding of the county of York, his Lordship this day took and subscribed the oath appointed to be taken thereupon instead of the oaths of allegiance, supremacy, and abjuration.

The Queen has been pleased to approve of Don Patricio Kilkelly as Consul at Barbados for the Republic of Peru.

By virtue of an Act passed in the twenty-fourth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to repeal so much of two Acts made in the tenth and fifteenth years of the reign of His present Majesty, as authorizes the Speaker of the House of Commons to issue his warrant to the Clerk of the Crown for making out writs for the election of Members to serve in Parliament, in the manner therein mentioned, and for substituting other provisions for the like purposes;" and of an Act passed in the twenty-sixth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to further limit and define the time for proceeding to Election during the Recess:"

I do hereby give notice, that the death of Richard Spooner, Esq., late a Member serving in this present Parliament for the Northern Division of the county of Warwick, hath been certified to me in writing under the hands of two Members serving in this present Parliament, and that I shall issue my Warrant to the Clerk of the Crown to make out a new writ for the electing of a Member to serve in this present Parliament for the said county, at the end of six days after the insertion of this notice in the London Gazette.
