Whitehall, November 30, 1864.

The Queen has been pleased to grant unto George Horner Reynard, of Whitehill Park, in the parish of Chester-le-Street, in the county of Durham, Esquire, and unto Augusta Sarah, his wife, daughter of the late John Cookson, of Whitehill Park aforesaid, Esquire, deceased, Her Royal license and authority that they may, in compliance with a clause contained in the last will and testament of the said John Cookson, Esquire, take and henceforth use the surname of Cookson, in addition to and after that of Reynard, that he may bear the arms of Cookson quarterly with those of Reynard, that she may bear the arms of Cookson only, and that such surnames and arms may be taken, borne, and used by the issue of their marriage; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the College of Arms, otherwise Her Majesty's Royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect;

And also to command that the said Royal concession and declaration be registered in Her Majesty's College of Arms.
