THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Ambassador at St. Petersburg, enclosing a copy of regulations relating to quarantine in Russian ports, and of which the following is a translation :—

1. THE protection of the coasts of the Baltic against the introduction of the plague is entrusted to the Swedish Quarantine Establishment at Kinsö, in the Cattegat, which is required to take, for the disinfection of vessels destined for Russian ports, for their cargoes, crews, and, in general, everything on board, the same precautions as are prescribed by the Swedish statutes for vessels entering Swedish ports.

2. All vessels entering Russian ports upon the Baltic, from whencesoever arriving (those only being excepted which are specified in Art. 9 of the present regulation), are required to be provided with a clean bill of health, delivered in the port of departure, and signed by the Russian Consul or Consular Agent, and in the case where no such officer exists, by the Swedish Consul, and failing this last, by one of the other Consuls to be designated by the Minister for Foreign Affairs.

3. In cases where a vessel shall have touched at several ports, the sanitary condition of each port shall be noted upon the bill of health by the Russian Consul, Agent, or other authorised person.

4. In cases of complete absence of the plague, such absence being declared and recognized by the Swedish Government notifications, all vessels,

from whencesoever they may arrive and if permitted by the Swedish quarantine regulations for Swedish ports, may repair directly to the Russian ports of the Baltic, where they will be admitted without delay upon presenting the clean bill of health required by the preceding Articles. In the event of the non-production of such document they will not be admitted.

Note. Captains of vessels destined for the Russian ports of the Baltic are required to have on board a copy of the Swedish quarantine regulations in force (Royal Ordinance of the 20th September, 1859), the 4th section of which clearly sets forth the circumstances under which vessels may proceed direct to the Swedish ports for which they are destined, and those which make necessary their touching first at Kinsö for examination and disinfection.

5. In time of plague, or suspicion of plague, when the Swedish Government notification declares certain places or ports infected or suspected, all vessels coming from such places or ports are required to touch at the quarantine establishment of Kinsö, in the Cattegat, to undergo quarantine, and the processes of disinfection, in conformity with the rules of that establishment; and, upon continuing their voyage to the Russian ports of the Baltic, they will be admitted to those ports only upon presentation of a bill of free pratique from the Kinsö establishment.

6. Vessels leaving healthy ports (which are recognized as such by the Swedish Government notifications) in time of plague, or suspected plague, may, even under these circumstances, if provided with their clean bill, proceed directly to the Baltic ports without stopping at Kinsö.

Upon arriving at any of these ports they will be required to undergo examination as to their communications with other vessels at sea since their departure from the last port where they received the consular signature, up to their arrival in a Baltic port.

If, upon interrogation, it appear that no meeting doubtful in nature has taken place upon the voyage, then the vessel will be admitted without delay.

Under contrary circumstances all communication with land will be interdicted for a certain time by authority of the port; or, in cases where serious doubts exist, the vessel will be sent back to Kinsö, to be replaced in quarantine by the Consul or Commercial Agent of Russia.

The examination of the vessel, and generally the verification of the bills of health, is undertaken

by the commander of the cruiser when he receives the passports and other ship's papers.

7. Consuls and agents are required to be careful that no vessel shall possess more than one bill of health. Should the bill be old or dirty, or entirely covered with signatures, it should be cancelled, and a new one given to the master, upon which the former ports of departure should be briefly enumerated, together with a statement of the principal remarks on the previous bill.

All the Russian Custom-houses and Customs-barriers, as well as the commanders of the revenue cruisers and the river authorities of the Baltic Sea and its gulfs, should be provided with models of the clean bills of health which the Swedish Government delivers to vessels to certify that their crews and cargoes have been disinfected and are free from risk, together with impressions of the seals used for these bills, and forms of the certificates delivered to the vessels which are not obliged to touch at Kinsö.

9. Vessels which have laden cargo at the foreign or Russian ports of the Baltic, or vessels in ballast from the same ports, are admitted to the Russian Baltic Ports without quarantine certificates.

10. For facility of distinction, all vessels proceeding from the North Sea to the Russian Baltic ports, should carry a green flag upon one of their masts, and are required to present their bills, during the voyage, to the commander of the first revenue cruiser they may encounter, as well as to the other commanders of such cruisers who may require their production.

11. Masters of vessels arriving at a port without bills, with irregular bills, or with bills showing erasures, or with interlineations, and who by reason of their port of departure are bound to produce bills in due form, are liable to a fine of 25 roubles, if unable to prove that they have lost their bills by violence, or other causes beyond control. A similar fine of 25 roubles will be imposed upon masters of vessels whose bills do not exhibit the signatures of Consuls, Russian Agents, or other authorised persons, setting forth the sanitary condition of the ports at which their vessels have touched.

12. Should the master insist upon the regularity of his bill the commander of the revenue cruiser shall immediately seize it, together with his papers, and forward them to the superior river authority, at the same time keeping the vessel at a distance and interdicting communication with her.

13. Upon the arrival of vessels at their destination their bills of health should be delivered by the commanders of the revenue cruisers to the Custom-house authorities to be cancelled.

14. (Relates to Russian vessels of war).

15. Consuls are required to communicate, without delay, to the Minister of Foreign Affairs and to the department of Foreign Commerce, detailed information with respect to the exhibition of symptoms of any contagious disease in their districts.
