Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that a letter from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, stating it to be his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentation shall be made at Levees, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain,

in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the parish of Brenchley, in the county of Kent;—

To the Clerk or Clerks to the Justices of the Petty Sessions held for the division or divisions in which the said parish is situate;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the population of the parish of Brenchley, in the county of Kent, according to the last census, exceeds two thousand persons.

And whereas at a meeting of the vestry, held at the vestry room of the church at Brenchley, after public notice in that behalf, on Thursday, the twenty-ninth day of December, 1864, it was resolved,—

“That application be forthwith made to the Poor Law Board to issue their Order for the appointment of a Vestry Clerk for the parish of Brenchley, at a salary of £10 per annum.”

And whereas the Churchwardens of the said parish have made their application in writing to the Poor Law Board, pursuant to the above resolution.

Now, therefore, we, the Poor Law Board, under the authority of the several Statutes in that behalf made and provided, hereby order and direct as follows, that is to say;—

ARTICLE I.—That so much of the Act passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, entitled “An Act to prevent the holding of Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, and for regulating the Appointment of Vestry Clerks,” as relates to the appointment of a Vestry Clerk, shall forthwith be applied, to and be put in force within, the said parish of Brenchley.

ARTICLE II.—That a salary of ten pounds per annum shall be paid to the Vestry Clerk for the time being, appointed under the authority of the statutes in such behalf and this Order, by the Churchwardens and Overseers of the poor of the said parish.

ARTICLE III.—That the salary of such Vestry Clerk shall be payable up to the day on which he ceases to hold such office, and no longer, and shall be paid by quarterly payments at the several quarters ending at the usual feast days in the year, namely, Lady Day, Midsummer Day, Michaelmas Day, and Christmas Day, with a proportionate sum to be paid to his executors or administrators in case he shall die while holding such office.

And we hereby order and direct that a copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette.

APPOINTMENT OF STANDINGS FOR HACKNEY CARRIAGES WITHIN THE METROPOLITAN POLICE DISTRICT ; AND REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED.

By virtue of an Act passed in the 13th year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled " An Act for consolidating the Office of the Registrar of Metropolitan Public Carriages with the Office of Commissioners of Police of the Metropolis, and making other provisions in regard to the consolidated Offices."

I, SIR RICHARD MAYNE, Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, do hereby appoint Standings for Hackney Carriages at the several places hereinafter mentioned, for such number of carriages at each standing as is specified, and within the boundaries set forth for each standing, provided that no hackney carriage shall be suffered to stand across any street or thoroughfare, or opposite the end of any street or carriage-way, or upon any place where foot passengers usually cross the carriage-way.

ELEVEN STANDINGS APPOINTED.

SUTHERLAND STREET, Pimlico.	Nine Carriages. In Sutherland Street, Pimlico, to commence three yards from the crossing at Sussex Street, and extend down the centre of Sutherland Street, towards Clarendon Street, as far as necessary for nine hackney carriages to stand.
UNION STREET, Berkeley Square.	Five Carriages. In Union Street, Berkeley Square, to commence six feet from the crossing in Hill Street, in the centre of Union Street, and extend forty yards towards Hayes Mews.
CAMBRIDGE ROAD, Bethnal Green.	Four Carriages. In the Cambridge Road, Bethnal Green, at its junction with the Bethnal Green Road, to commence from the Urinal along the West side of the road next the kerb, as far as No. 6, Cambridge Terrace.

ISLINGTON GREEN	Ten Carriages. At Islington Green, to commence at the North-west corner of the iron-railings surrounding the Green, and extend along the kerbstone on the North side to the North-east corner of the Green, leaving a distance of ten yards between the fifth and sixth carriages.
BLACKHEATH HILL, Greenwich.	Six Carriages. On Blackheath Hill, Greenwich, to commence opposite the "George and Dragon" public house, in the centre of the road at the foot of the hill, and extend Eastward up Blackheath Hill as far as necessary for six hackney-carriages to stand.
BLENHEIM TERRACE, Saint John's Wood.	Ten Carriages. In Blenheim Terrace, Saint John's Wood, to commence at the North-east corner of Blenheim Terrace, and extend along the kerbstone as far as necessary for two carriages, and for eight carriages to commence opposite Blenheim Passage, in the centre of the same road, and extend as far as necessary for eight carriages.
GOLDINGTON CRESCENT, Old Saint Pancras Road.	Ten Carriages. In the Old Saint Pancras Road, in the parish of Saint Pancras, to commence five yards East of the Drinking Fountain on the North side of Goldington Crescent, and extend Eastward along the edge of the kerbstone, as far as necessary for ten hackney carriages to stand.

BALHAM HILL ROAD, Clapham.	Ten Carriages. In the Balham Hill Road, Clapham, to commence at the North east end of the Balham Hill Road, opposite the Finger Post, and extend along the edge of the footpath next the Green, towards Balham, as far as necessary for ten hackney carriages to stand.
