

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1858.**TONG STREET, IN THE COUNTY OF YORK.**

WHEREAS a Resolution for the adoption of the Local Government Act, 1858, was, on the 16th day of November last, passed by the district of Tong Street, in the county of York, within the boundaries of that district, as settled for the purposes of the hereinbefore recited Act; and notice thereof, in writing, was given to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, as required by such Act, and appeals have been duly made to me against the validity of the vote for the adoption of the said Act; and inquiry has been directed into the matters therein alleged, and report made to me thereon:

Now, therefore, I, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State as aforesaid, do hereby make order, with respect to the matters in question on such appeals, as follows, namely:—that the said vote for the adoption of the Local Government Act, 1858, passed by the said district of Tong Street, on the 16th day of November last, was invalid.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1858.**NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ACT BY GUISBOROUGH, YORKSHIRE.**

WHEREAS the Local Government Act, 1858, was adopted in the township of Guisborough, in the county of York, on the 25th day of January, 1865; and whereas notice of such adoption has been duly given, in writing, to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, as required by such Act; and the other requirements of the said Act have been complied with:

Now, therefore, I, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State as aforesaid, do hereby give notice that the Local Government Act, 1858, has been duly adopted in the hereinbefore named township of Guisborough, and that the said Act will have the force of law therein at the expiration of two months from the date of the resolution adopting such Act.

Monmouth, Forest of Dean, and Standish Junction Railway.

(Additional Provision; Alteration of portion of Line, and Levels of Railway No. 1, and increased height of Bridge over River Severn.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that it is intended to apply to Parliament, by Petition for Additional Provision, for leave to alter the line and levels of a portion of the Railway numbered 1 in the 24th Section of the Bill now pending in Parliament, bearing the above name or short title, and also numbered 1 on the plans deposited in respect of that Bill with the Clerk of the Peace of the county of Gloucester on or before the 30th day of November last, for the purpose of increasing the height of the bridge over the River Severn; such alteration commencing at or near the point in the parish of Arlingham, in the county

of Gloucester, indicating on those deposited plans the distance of 5 miles 1 furlong from the commencement of the said Railway No. 1, and terminating at or near the point in the parish of Awre, in the said county, indicating on the same plans the distance of 6 miles 6 furlongs from the commencement of that railway, which intended altered or deviated portion of the said Railway No. 1 will be wholly situated in the said parishes of Arlingham and Awre, in the county of Gloucester:

And notice is also given, that the Bill now pending in Parliament, bearing the above name or short title, will be so amended as to authorize and carry into effect the said intended alteration or deviation of line and levels; and powers will be taken therein for the purchase, by compulsion or agreement, of the lands required for such altered or deviated line, and to vary or extinguish such rights and privileges as may interfere with the construction or use thereof; and to levy tolls, rates, or duties in respect thereof; and the several provisions of the said Bill will be made to apply to such altered or deviated portion of Railway No. 1 in the same manner and to the same extent as if it had originally been comprised in and authorized by the said Bill:

And it is also intended to relinquish so much of the said Railway No. 1, delineated on the said deposited plans and sections of the Monmouth, Forest of Dean, and Standish Junction Railway as lies between the aforesaid point of commencement of such altered or deviated line, in the parish of Arlingham, and the aforesaid termination thereof, in the parish of Awre, as will be rendered unnecessary by the substitution of such altered or deviated portion of line between the aforesaid points.

Maps, plans, and sections, showing the direction, line, and levels of the proposed altered or deviated portion of the said Railway No. 1, with books of reference to such plans, and also a copy of this notice, were, on or before the 4th day of March, 1865, deposited with the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Gloucester, at his office in the city of Gloucester; at the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons; at the office of the Clerk of the Parliaments; at the office of the Board of Trade; and at the office of the Board of Admiralty; and a copy of so much of the said plans, sections, and books of reference as relates to each of the said parishes of Arlingham and Awre, together with a copy of this notice, will, on or before the said 4th day of March, be deposited with the respective parish clerks of those parishes at their residences.
