

the said chapelry district of Greasborough (in testimony whereof they have respectively signed and sealed this representation), we humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said parish of Rotherham, and of the said chapelry district of Greasborough, which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint John the Evangelist, situate at Masbrough aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint John the Evangelist, Masbrough;' and that the right of presentation and appointment to the church of such consolidated chapelry should belong to and be exercised by the said William, Archbishop of York, and his successors, Archbishops of York, for ever.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to your Majesty, in your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint John the Evangelist, Masbrough, being:—

"All that portion of the parish of Rotherham, in the county of York, and in the diocese of York, wherein the present incumbent of such parish now possesses the exclusive cure of souls, which is bounded on the south-east by an imaginary line extending along the middle of the river Don, on the west by the chapelry district of Saint Thomas, Kimberworth, sometime part of the aforesaid parish, and on the north by the chapelry district of Greasborough, also sometime part of the same parish of Rotherham.

"And also all that portion of the said chapelry district of Greasborough which is situate to the south of an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides such chapelry district from the said parish of Rotherham, at a point in the middle of the line of the Midland Railway; and extending thence, north-eastward, along the middle of the said line of railway, for a distance of five furlongs, or thereabouts, to the centre of the bridge which carries such line of railway over the private road leading from Wentworth Woodhouse to Kirk Gate Lodge; and extending thence, south-eastward, along the middle of such private road, to its junction with the road leading from Park Gate to Masbrough; and extending thence, southward, along the middle of the last-described road, as far as the boundary which divides the said chapelry district of Greasborough from the parish of Rotherham aforesaid."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of York.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen; of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-seven; and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and twenty-four; duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-third day of February, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, in the words following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen; of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty, chapter thirty-seven; and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and twenty-four; have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the parish of Kelloe, in the county of Durham, and in the diocese of Durham, and out of the parish of Bishop Middleham, in the same county and diocese.

"Whereas it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said parish of Kelloe, and of the said parish of Bishop Middleham, which are hereinafter mentioned and described (such portions not at present containing within their limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship), should be constituted a separate district in the manner hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas certain hereditaments and premises situate within the said parish of Kelloe have become vested in us under the provisions of and for the purposes of the herein mentioned Acts.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles, Bishop of the said diocese of Durham (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme), we humbly recommend and propose, that all those several portions of the said parish of Kelloe, and of the said parish of Bishop Middleham, which are respectively mentioned and described in the schedule hereunder written, and which are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme, become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named 'The District of Cassop-cum-Quarrington.'

"And we further recommend and propose, that there shall be paid by us, in each and every year, to the minister for the time being of the district so recommended to be constituted, when duly licensed according to the provisions of the herein secondly mentioned Act, the sum of two hundred pounds, and that so soon as a church shall have been erected within such district, and shall have been approved by us, and consecrated as the church of such district, and for the use and service of the minister and inhabitants thereof, and such district shall have thereupon become, according to the provisions of the said last-men-
