The aim in exhibiting the above mentioned objects is to make them universally known, to incite the imitation and perfection thereof, to recommend the way of employing and using the same, to point out their cheap production, to expose to view the peculiarities, customs, and exigencies in some districts; in short, to give a complete insight into farmers' and foresters' household arrangements, in all countries.

Consequently, such objects can only be accepted that are recommendable by the solidity of the material and their workmanship, by usefulness and cheapness, and by statement of the wholesale and retail prices at the place where they are manufactured, produced, or sent from.

The space reserved for the above articles, only permits of single specimens of each genus being exhibited.
