LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1858.**NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ACT BY BOLTON (TOWNSHIP), YORKSHIRE.**

WHEREAS a resolution for the adoption of the Local Government Act, 1858, has been passed by the township of Bolton, in the parish of Calverley, in the West Riding of the county of York, that being a place with a population of less than 3,000 by the last census. And whereas it has appeared to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, that, by reason of special circumstances, it is expedient that the said township should be allowed to adopt the said Act, I do hereby approve of such adoption by the township aforesaid; and I do hereby further order that the Local Government Act, 1858, do come into force within such township of Bolton, from and after the 17th day of June, 1865.
