ag many things proposed and agitated in Treaties that never come to any Conclusion; and in those cases, the end and scope of the Treaty, and the Right of Nations, are supposed to take place in the most equitable Construction: And that this was the sense of the several Colledges, may be evinced from their respective Registers. But there was yet further to be confidered in the present case, That besides there had been no mention made of the County of Spanberm (to which Tra. rback, without controversie, belongs) in those Acts and Memorials made on several occasions, between the years 1680 and 1623, wherein were enumerated the particulars within the Territory thus yielded, even to the most inconsiderable Villages and Cattles: It appeared by a Declaration delivered to Count Lobcowitz, That the Crown of France did not then pretend to erect new Forts, but only to perfect those that were already begun. And that the Close of the faid Memorial was, That his Imperial Majesty so far confided in the Jultice of the Most Christian King, that if a reprefentation were made of this matter by the States of the Empire, he would then make due reflections thereon: Wherefore he recommended it to them to confider in what manner they would think fit to make their Remonstrance to the faid King, to diffuade him from difcomposing the publick Tranquility of the Empire by any fuch novel Undertaking. It is faid, That the Count de Crecy, Plenipotentiary from France, having notice of the faid Memorial, had fignified to Count Wird Agratz, as Director of the Diet, That his Most Christian Majety was so well founded in his Rights of Sovereignty over those Countries, yielded to him by the Treaty of Fruce for the whole term of 20 years; that any Endeavours to abridge him in the fame, would have no other effect, but to shew that there were fome who were not defirous the Truce should be observed, which was at first thought so necessary for the good of the Empire.
