Pon the Death of Dr. Clarke, late President of St. Mary Magdalen Colledge in Oxford, the Fellows of that Loukdge, having chosen Dr. John Hough for their President, without any regard to His Majethes Letters Mandatory, which had been delivered to them before the day of Election, in behalf of another Person, pretending to justifie their Disobedience from the Obligation they lay under to observe their Statutes, notwithstanding that His Majethy had been pleased to dispense with them in that case (as had been done in all times by his Majethies Prodecessors) and the said Fellows obstitutely berishing to runder ineffectual those Methods which His Majethy in His Grace and Eavor to them had made use of, to bring them to a sense of their Dury: His Majethy thought his for the Maintenance of His Just Authority and Royal Propagative, to app int a Vistation of the said Colledge; And accordingly the Reversed Father in God, Thomas, Lord Bishep of Chefter, on Robert Wright Knight, Lord Chief Justice of the Rungt Bench, and S.s. Thomas, Lunner Knight, one of the Barons of

the Exchequer, being Authorized under the Great Soal of Engaland, met at Oxford the 21th daylet October last, rwhose the said Fellows, with Pr. Vienna, Novemb. 20.
