LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1858.

NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ACT BY CONSETT, COUNTY DURHAM.

WHEREAS the Local Government Act, 1858, was duly adopted on the 6th day of July, 1865, by the district of Consett, in the county of Durham, within the boundaries of that district, as settled for the purposes of the hereinbefore recited Act; and notice of such adoption has been duly given, in writing, to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, as required by such Act; and whereas it has been duly certified to me that a copy of such notice has been duly advertised, and that copies have also been affixed to the principal doors of each church and chapel in such district, to which notices are usually affixed, and the period fixed by the said Act for appeal has now expired, and no such appeal has been made:

Now, therefore, I, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, do hereby give notice that the Local Government Act, 1858, has been adopted within the said district of Consett, in the county of Durham; and that the Local Government Act, 1858, will come into force within the aforesaid district of Consett, at the expiration of two months from the date of its adoption as aforesaid.

NOTICE OF INTENDED DISTRIBUTION OF NAVAL PIRATE BOUNTY.

Department of the Accountant-General of the Navy, Admiralty, Somerset-House, August 24, 1865.

NOTICE is hereby given, to the Officers, Seamen, and Marines, and to all persons interested

therein, that the distribution of the bounty awarded for services against pirates in the China Seas, on the 19th and 20th October, 1862, to the captain and a party of small arm men and marines from Her Majesty's ship "Encounter," and to the crews of Her Majesty's gunboats "Hardy" and "Flamer," will commence on Tuesday, the 5th proximo, in the Prize Branch of the Department of the "Accountant-General of the Navy, Admiralty, Somerset House."

Agents and other persons holding powers of attorney, prize orders, assignments, or other instruments, by virtue of which they may be legally entitled to claim the share of any one serving in the above-named ship, are requested to present the same at this office.

Any Officer, Seaman, Marine, or other person, who may desire to receive his share from the Collector of Customs or of Inland Revenue within the United Kingdom, is required to intimate the same by letter to be addressed "On Prize Business, to the Secretary of the Admiralty, London," (enclosing his certificate of service, or an attested copy thereof, excepting in the case of Commissioned Officers),—in which letter his own place of residence is to be precisely stated, as well as the place of the nearest Collector of Customs, or of Inland Revenue, from whom it would be convenient to receive such share of pirate bounty.
