

the said parish of Hillingdon from another detached portion of the parish of Cowley aforesaid; and extending thence first northward and then westward, along the last-described boundary (crossing the Cowley-road), as far as a point in the middle of Fray's River; and extending thence in a direction mainly northward along the middle of the said river as far as a point near Rab's Mill, on the boundary dividing the said parish of Hillingdon from the new parish of Saint John, Uxbridge Moor, in the county and diocese aforesaid; and extending thence north-westward along the last described boundary (following thereby the course of the said Fray's River) to the junction of such boundary with the boundary dividing the said parish of Hillingdon from the new parish of Saint Margaret, Uxbridge, in the county and diocese aforesaid; and extending thence first north-eastward and then north-westward along the last described boundary to its junction at the place called 'The Pool' with the boundary dividing the said parish of Hillingdon from the parish of Denham, in the county of Buckingham, and in the diocese of Oxford; and extending thence first north-eastward and then north-westward along the said boundary (which is also the boundary dividing the said county of Middlesex from the said county of Buckingham) to its junction with the boundary dividing the said parish of Hillingdon from the parish of Harefield, in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London aforesaid; and extending thence in a direction mainly south-eastward along the last described parish boundary to its junction at the bridge over the Ickenham-brook aforesaid, called Ickenham-bridge, with the boundary dividing the said parish of Hillingdon from the parish of Ickenham in the last named county and diocese; and extending thence in a direction mainly southward along the middle of the said brook as far as the centre of Stafford-bridge, where the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of London.

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and twenty-four, sections three, four, and seven, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the third day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-

five, in the words and figures following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of your Majesty's reign, chapter one hundred and twenty-four, sections three, four, and seven, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme for assigning certain lands and hereditaments as the permanent endowment of the see of Carlisle.

"Whereas the Honorable and Right Reverend Samuel, Bishop of Carlisle, succeeded to the said see on an avoidance which happened before the passing of the hereinbefore-mentioned Act; and has now as such bishop an income of four thousand and five hundred pounds per annum, being the amount contemplated by Parliament, and named for the bishops of the see of Carlisle in the Order of your Majesty in Council of the twentieth-fifth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one.

"And whereas the said Samuel, Bishop of Carlisle, has signified to us his willingness to accept as the endowment for his see, the lands, tenements, and hereditaments particularly described in the schedule hereto annexed, which are now vested in us in fee simple in possession, the same being in the judgment of our Estates Committee convenient to be held as the endowment of the said see, and calculated to secure to the holder thereof as nearly as may be (after deducting costs of management) a net annual income of four thousand and five hundred pounds, and no more.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Samuel, Lord Bishop of Carlisle, testified by his having signed this scheme, and sealed the same with his episcopal seal, we humbly recommend and propose, that upon the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly published Order, the lands, tenements, and hereditaments particularly described in the schedule hereto annexed, with their appurtenances, and all our right, title, and interest therein, and all our right, title, and interest in any tithes, or rent-charges in lieu of tithes, arising out of the said lands, tenements, and hereditaments, or charged thereupon, and in the benefit of the perpetual land-tax, if any, charged upon the same premises, which has been redeemed, shall be assigned as the endowment of the bishoprick of Carlisle, and shall become and be absolutely vested in the said bishop, in as full and ample a manner as if the same had formed part of the ancient possessions of the said see, and that the said bishop shall become entitled to the rents, profits, and proceeds of such lands, tenements, and hereditaments, as from the second day of August now last past.

"And we further recommend and propose that the money payment payable by us under the provisions of the Order of your Majesty in Council of the twenty-fourth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, shall, as from the said second day of August now last past, cease and determine.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said hereinbefore-mentioned Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.
