

parish of Frensham, and also all that portion of the particular district of Saint Stephen, Shotter Mill, which are described in the Second Schedule hereunto annexed (all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are respectively delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto also annexed and numbered 2), shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme, be constituted and become and be a separate district for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint John, Churt.'

"And we further recommend and propose that there shall be paid by us in each and every year to the minister for the time being of the said district of Saint John, Churt, so recommended to be constituted as aforesaid, when duly licensed according to the provisions of the herein thirdly-mentioned Act, the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds, and that the said sum of one hundred and fifty pounds shall be paid by equal half-yearly payments on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year, and that the first such payment, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be made on the first day of May or of November next after the day of the date of the licence of such minister as aforesaid, and that in case a vacancy in the ministry of such district shall happen on any other day than the first day of May or the first day of November, the amount then next thereafter payable shall be duly apportioned between and paid to the minister making the vacancy, or his personal representative or representatives, and the minister succeeding to such district; provided always, that such payment shall cease to be made by us upon and from the expiration or other determination of the outstanding lease or grant of the tithes or commutation tithe rent-charges arising within the said parish of Frensham, and recommended to be vested in the incumbent of the perpetual curacy of the same parish as hereinbefore mentioned.

"And we further recommend and propose, that when and so soon as the incumbent of the said parish of Frensham shall come into the possession of the tithes or commutation tithe rent-charges so to be vested in him as aforesaid, the same shall thenceforth and for ever be charged and chargeable with and liable to the payment of a yearly sum of one hundred and fifty pounds to the minister for the time being of the said district of Saint John, Churt, so recommended to be constituted, and that such last-mentioned sum shall be paid by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of April and the first day of October in each and every year, and that the first of such half-yearly payments, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be due upon the first day of April or the first day of October, as the case may be, next following the expiration or other determination of the said lease or grant of the tithes or commutation tithe rent-charges herein lastly mentioned, and that the minister of the said district of Saint John, Churt, and his successors, shall have all legal remedies for enforcing payment of the said annual sum of one hundred and fifty pounds, or any part thereof, that may be due and unpaid.

"And we further recommend and propose, that the whole right of patronage of the said district of Saint John, Churt, so recommended to be constituted, and of the nomination of the minister thereof, shall, without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London

Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and become absolutely vested in and shall and may, from time to time, be exercised by the said John Sutton Utterton, Archdeacon of Surrey, and by his successors, Archdeacons of Surrey, for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose, that the tithes or commutation tithe rent-charges issuing, arising, and payable out of lands, tenements, and hereditaments situate within the said parish of Seale, and heretofore belonging to the said archdeaconry of Surrey, so to be vested in us as aforesaid, and all our estate and interest therein, shall, upon and from the expiration or other determination of the outstanding lease or grant of such tithes or commutation tithe rent-charges, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this scheme, and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, be transferred to and become and be absolutely vested in the incumbent for the time being of the perpetual curacy of the said parish of Seale, subject to the provisos and conditions hereinafter mentioned.

"And we further recommend and propose, that so soon as the new church situate at Tongham, within the parish of Seale, and hereinbefore referred to, shall have been consecrated, and a consolidated chapelry or other ecclesiastical district shall have been assigned to such church under the provisions of the Church Building Acts, or some of them, there shall be paid by us out of our Common Fund, in each and every year, to the incumbent for the time being of the said church, when duly licensed, the sum of one hundred pounds by equal half-yearly payments on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year; provided always, that such payment shall cease to be made by us upon and from the expiration or other determination of the outstanding lease or grant of the tithes or commutation tithe rent-charges arising within the said parish of Seale, and so to be vested in the incumbent of the perpetual curacy of the same parish as hereinbefore mentioned.

"And we further recommend and propose that when and so soon as the incumbent of the said parish of Seale shall come into possession of the tithes or commutation tithe rent-charges lastly hereinbefore referred to, he shall, yearly and every year, pay to the incumbent for the time being of the said church at Tongham (if the said church shall have been duly consecrated, and a consolidated chapelry or other ecclesiastical district shall have been legally assigned to it as hereinbefore mentioned), the sum of one hundred pounds clear of all deductions (except property or income tax, if any) and that such sum shall be paid by equal half-yearly payments on the first day of April and the first day of October in each and every year, and that the first of such half-yearly payments, or a proportionate part thereof, shall be due on the first day of April or the first day of October, as the case may be, next following the expiration or other determination of the said lease or grant of the tithes or commutation tithe rent-charges, lastly hereinbefore mentioned.

"And we further recommend and propose, that such annual sum of one hundred pounds, and each and every instalment thereof, shall be, and be deemed to be charged upon all the tithes or commutation tithe rent-charges so to be vested in the incumbent of the said parish of Seale as aforesaid, and that the incumbent for the time being of the said church at Tongham, shall have all legal remedies for enforcing payment of the said annual sum of one hundred pounds, or any part thereof, that may be due and unpaid.

"And we further recommend and propose, that the tithes, or commutation tithe rent-charges
