

issuing, arising, and payable out of lands, tenements, and hereditaments situate within the said parish of Elstead, and heretofore belonging to the said Archdeaconry of Surrey, so to be vested in us as aforesaid, and all our estate and interest therein, shall upon and from the expiration of or other determination of the outstanding lease or grant of such tithes or commutation tithe rent-charges, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this scheme, and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, be transferred to and become absolutely vested in the incumbent for the time being of the perpetual curacy of the said parish of Elstead.

"And we further recommend and propose that the tithes or commutation tithe rent-charges issuing, arising, and payable out of lands, tenements, and hereditaments situate within the said parish of Bentley, and heretofore belonging to the said Archdeaconry of Surrey, so to be vested in us as aforesaid, and all our estate and interest therein, shall upon and from the expiration or other determination of the outstanding lease or grant of such tithes or commutation tithe rent-charges, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this scheme, and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, become and be transferred to and absolutely vested in the incumbent for the time being of the perpetual curacy of the said parish of Bentley.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The First Schedule to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Tilford, being:—

"All that part of the parish of Saint Andrew, Farnham, in the county of Surrey, and in the diocese of Winchester, which is situate generally to the south of an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish from the parish of Seal, in the same county and diocese, at a point near Crooksbury Hill, in the middle of the road leading from Runfold to Waverley Mill; and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the same road, to its junction near Waverley Mill with the road leading past Waverley House to Farnham; and extending thence north-westward, along the middle of the last described road, to its junction near Waverley North Lodge with Sandy Lane; and extending thence south-westward, along the middle of the last-named lane, to its junction with the road leading from Farnham to Tilford; and continuing thence still south-westward, across the last-described road, to a point in the middle of the north-eastern end of the New Road leading over Lodge Hill to Short Heath and Wrecclesham; and continuing thence still south-westward, along the middle of the last described road, to its junction at Fox Hill with the road leading from Farnham to Frensham; and extending thence southward, for a distance of one hundred and twenty-five yards or thereabouts, along the middle of the last described road, to the boundary which divides the said parish of Farnham from the parish of Frensham, in the county and diocese aforesaid.

"The Second Schedule to which the foregoing scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint John, Churt, being:—

"All those several portions of the parish of Frensham, in the county of Surrey, and in the diocese of Winchester, and of the particular district of Saint Stephen, Shotter Mill, sometime part of the said parish, which are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Frensham from the parish of Headley, in the county of Southampton, and in the said diocese of Winchester, at a point on the southern margin of Frensham Great Pond; and extending thence in a direction mainly southward along the said parish boundary, which is also the county boundary, to its junction with the boundary dividing the said particular district of Saint Stephen, Shotter Mill, from the parish of Headley aforesaid; and continuing thence, first generally southward and then south-eastward, along the last described boundary, continuing thereby to follow the said county boundary, and passing Whitmoor Farm as far as a point in the middle of the cross road leading from Headley to the London and Portsmouth turnpike road; and extending thence eastward, along the middle of such cross road, to its junction with the said turnpike road; and extending thence first north-eastward and then eastward, along the middle of the same turnpike road as far as its intersection by the boundary dividing the said particular district of Saint Stephen, Shotter Mill, from the parish of Thursley, in the county of Surrey and diocese of Winchester aforesaid; and extending thence northward, along the last described boundary to its junction with the boundary dividing the said particular district of Saint Stephen, Shotter Mill, from the parish of Elstead, in the last-named county and diocese; and continuing thence still northward, along the last described boundary to its junction with the boundary dividing the said parish of Frensham from the parish of Elstead aforesaid; and extending thence in a direction generally northward, along the last described boundary to its junction with the boundary dividing the said parish of Frensham from the parish of Farnham, in the same county and diocese; and extending thence north-westward, along the last described boundary, to the point where it is met by the northern boundary of the tithing of Churt, in the said parish of Frensham; and extending thence first south-westward and then north-westward, along the said tithing boundary to its junction with the boundary which divides the said parish of Frensham from the parish of Headley aforesaid, at the first described point on the southern margin of Frensham Great Pond, where the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas a draft of the said scheme has been, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore, thirdly mentioned Act, transmitted to the patron, and to the vicar of the vicarage of the said parish of Saint Andrew, Farnham (out of which it is proposed that "The District of Tilford," recommended in the said scheme to be constituted shall be taken) and the said patron and vicar (being one and the same person) has signified his assent to the said scheme.

And whereas a draft of the said scheme has been, in accordance with the provisions of the said lastly-mentioned Act, also transmitted to the patrons of the perpetual curacy of the said parish of Frensham, and to the patron and incumbent of the perpetual curacy of the said par-
