

particular district of Saint Stephen, Shotter Mill (out of which said parish and particular district, it is proposed that "The District of Saint John, Churt," recommended in the said scheme to be constituted shall be taken).

And whereas one calendar month has elapsed since such draft was so transmitted to the said patrons of the parish of Frensham, and no objections have been made by any of them to the said scheme.

And whereas the patron and also the incumbent of the said particular district of Saint Stephen, Shotter Mill, have signified their assent to the said scheme.

And whereas a writ of sequestration has been issued, whereby the temporalities of the said perpetual curacy of the parish of Frensham aforesaid have been sequestered into the hand of John Burder, No. 27, Parliament-street, in the City of Westminster, Esquire, the sequestrator in the same writ named and appointed.

And whereas a draft of the said scheme has been in accordance with the provisions of the said lastly mentioned Act, and of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty, chapter ninety-four, transmitted to the said John Burder, as such sequestrator as aforesaid, and he, as such sequestrator, has signified his assent to the same scheme.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Winchester.

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the ninth day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, in the words following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty, chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of your Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Paul, situate within the limits of the new parish of Saint Matthias,

Bethnal-green, in the county of Middlesex, and in the diocese of London.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said new parish of Saint Matthias, Bethnal Green, and of the new parish of Saint Thomas, Bethnal Green, in the county and diocese aforesaid, which lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such respective new parishes.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that such contiguous portions of the said new parish of Saint Matthias, Bethnal Green, and of the said new parish of Saint Thomas, Bethnal Green, should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint Paul, situate within the limits of the first-named new parish as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Archibald Campbell, Bishop of the said diocese of London, as such bishop, and also as the patron, in right of his see, both of the perpetual curacy of the said new parish of Saint Matthias, Bethnal Green, and of the perpetual curacy of the said new parish of Saint Thomas, Bethnal Green (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this representation) we humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all these contiguous portions of the said new parish of Saint Matthias, Bethnal Green, and of the said new parish of Saint Thomas, Bethnal Green, which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Paul, situate within the limits of the first-named new parish as aforesaid, and that the same should be named "The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Paul, Bethnal Green," and that the right of presentation and appointment to the church of such consolidated chapelry should belong to and be exercised by the said Archibald Campbell, Bishop of the said diocese of London, and by his successors, bishops of the same diocese, for ever.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to your Majesty, in your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Paul, Bethnal Green, being

"All that portion of the new parish of Saint Matthias, Bethnal Green, in the county of Middlesex, and in the diocese of London, which is situate to the north of an imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides such new parish from the new parish of Saint Philip, Bethnal Green, in the same county and diocese, at a point in the middle of Church-street, opposite to the middle of the southern end of Tyssen-street; and extending thence north-eastward, along the middle of Church-street aforesaid, as far as a point on the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Matthias, Bethnal Green, from the parish of Saint Matthew, Bethnal Green, in the county and diocese aforesaid, opposite to the middle of the southern end of the street or lane called Gate-wells, Hents.
