Provided always, that it shall not be unlawful for any person to send or carry any such animal by railway through or out of the said borough, or to send or carry any such animal, if brought by sea, from any place out of Great Britain into the said borough to the nearest convenient Railway Station for the purpose of carrying it through or out of the said borough.

CATTLE PLAGUE.

County of Forjar.

THE Justices of the Peace for the county of Forfar, in Quarter Sessions assembled at Forfar, on 17th day of January, 1866, considering that it is expedient that the animals defined in the third clause of the Order of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, dated 23rd November, 1865, with the exception of sheep, lambs, goats, and swine, be excluded from all markets and fairs within their jurisdiction do hereby give notice and declare in accordance with the sixteenth clause of the said Order that it shall not be lawful for any person to bring or send any cow, heifer, bull, bullock, ox, or calf, to any markets or fairs appointed to be held within their jurisdiction, or to any place whatever within their jurisdiction, for the purpose of exhibition or sale, or to receive, exhibit, buy, or sell any such animals so brought or sent, and that during the period from the 31st day of January, 1866, and until the 1st day of March thereafter.

And the said Justices also hereby give notice and declare in accordance with the eighteenth clause of the said Order that animals as defined in said Order shall not be brought from any other part of Great Britain into any place within their jurisdiction during the above period, from the 31st day of January, 1866, until the 1st day of March thereafter, with the exception of sheep, lambs, goats, and swine, and also cows and heifers which have been affected with the Cattle Plague and have been recovered therefrom for at least six weeks, and which have during that period been kept separate and apart from all diseased animals.

Intimation is hereby give that every person offending against these Orders shall for every such offence forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding twenty pounds.

County of Carnarvon.

By virtue and in pursuance of an Order of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, dated the 16th day of December, 1865, made in pursuance of the several Acts of Parliament therein mentioned, we, Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace for the county of Carnarvon, assembled at the Hilary Quarter Sessions held at Carnarvon, in and for the said county, on Thursday, the 4th day of January, 1866, do now, by this notice, order and declare that it is expedient that, until the 1st day of March next, no cow, heifer, bull, bullock, ox, calf, sheep, or swine, or any hides,

be removed or taken from any part or parts of the county of Carnarvon, lying to the east of the River Conway, into any other part or parts of the same county, for any purpose or under any conditions whatever. And further, that until such 1st day of March next, no such animal or article as before defined shall be removed or taken to any market or fair within any part of the said county, for the purpose of exhibition or sale, and that no such animals or articles as before defined shall be brought into the said county, or any part thereof, from any place or places whatsoever (except that cattle, sheep, and pigs, for immediate slaughter, may be brought by road only into the said county, from any part of the county of Anglesey, except the parish of Holyhead).

Provided that it shall not be unlawful for any person to send or carry any such animals by railway without stoppage through our said county.

Every person offending against the above Order is liable to a penalty of not exceeding $\pounds 20$.

PURSUANT to and by virtue of the Orders of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, dated respectively the 23rd day of November, 1865, and the 16th day of December, 1865, and of the several statutes therein mentioned or re-ferred to, I, William Maysmor Williams, Esquire, Mayor of the said city and borough do by this notice, with a view to prevent the sprcading of the disorder designated the "Cattle Plague," declare that it is expedient, and accordingly I do order

That from the 24th day of January instant to the 1st day of March next, no cow, heifer, bull, bullock, ox, or calf shall be brought from any place, not being within the said city and borough, into the said city and borough or any part thereof between the hours of six o'clock p.m. and six o'clock a.m. 2nd. That from the said 24th day of January

instant to the said 1st day of March next, no cow, heifer, bull, bullock, ox, or calf shall be removed from any place within the said city and borough to any other place within the said city and borough, or on, along, or across any street, highway, lane, or occupation or other road in the said city and borough, or the sides thereof respectively, between the hours of six o'clock p.m. and six o'clock a.m.

3rd. That from the said 24th day of January instant to the said first day of March next, no carcase or hide, or part of the carcase or hide of any cow, heifer, bull, bullock, ox, or calf shall be brought into the said city and borough, or any part thereof, or be removed from any place within the said city and borough to any other place within the said city and borough between the hours of six o'clock p.m. and six o'clock a.m.

4th. Provided that nothing in this Order shall make it unlawful for any person having first obtained the written licence of the chief constable or surveyor of the said city and borough to remove, between the hours aforesaid, any such animal as aforesaid which has died or been slaughtered in any place within the said city and borough to any other place skins, horns, or hoofs of any such animals, shall | to be specified in such licence within the said
