PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by an Act of Parliament passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixth and seventh years of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An' "Act for rendering more easy the taking the poll "at county elections," it is enacted, that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, from time to time, on petition from the Justices of any county, riding, parts, or division in England or Wales, in Quarter Sessions assembled, representing that the number of polling places for such county, riding, parts, or division, is insufficient, and praying that the place or places mentioned in the said petition may be a polling place or polling places for the county, riding, parts, or division of the county within which such place or places is or are situate, to declare that any place or places mentioned in the said petition shall be a polling place or polling places for that county, riding, parts, or division, and that the Justices of the Peace for such county, riding, parts, or division, in Quarter Sessions or some special sessions assembled, as mentioned in the Act passed in the second and third years of the reign of His said late Majesty, intituled "An Act to settle and " describe the divisions of counties and the limits " of cities and boroughs in England and Wales, in "so far as respects the election of members to " serve in Parliament," shall, conformably to the last Act mentioned, divide such county, riding, parts, or division into convenient polling districts, and assign one of such districts to each polling place:

And whereas the Justices of the Peace for the county of Warwick, in Quarter Sessions assembled, on Tuesday, the second day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, have presented a petition to Her Majesty, representing that the number of polling places at present existing in the southern division of the said county of Warwick is insufficient, and praying that Alcester, situate within the said division, may be a polling place for the said southern division of the said county of Warwick:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, having taken the petition into consideration, is pleased, by and | Four Assistant-Surgeons, on Naval pay.

with the advice of Her Privy Council, to declare, order, and direct, and it is hereby declared, ordered, and directed, that "Alcester" shall be a polling place for the said southern division of the said county; and that the Justices of the Peace for the said county, in Quarter Sessions or some special sessions assembled, as mentioned in the said Act passed in the second and third years of the reign of His said late Majesty, shall, conformably to the said Act, divide such southern division of the said county into convenient polling districts, and assign one of such districts to each polling place.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the ninth of February, one thousand eight hundred and sixty six, in the words following; viz.:-

"Whereas by your Majesty's Order in Council of the ninth of September, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, a scale of establishment and salaries is fixed for the officers and clerks in your Majesty's Naval Hospital at Greenwich; and whereas, from subsequent experience, we are humbly of opinion that certain alterations in that scheme will be advisable; we beg leave to submit that your Majesty will be graciously pleased, by your Order in Council, to authorize the following scale of establishment and salaries of officers, clerks, and others, in Greenwich Hospital and Schools, to be substituted for that now in force:--

HOSPITAL.

One Captain Superintendent ••• £800 a-year. Two Lieutenants, with half-pay, each 230 One Inspector-General, on Naval pay. One Deputy Inspector-General, on Naval pay. One Surgeon and Medical Storekeeper, on Naval
