The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by an Act passed in the present session of Parliament, intituled "An Act "to amend the law relating to contagious or in-"fectious diseases in cattle and other animals," it is, amongst other things, enacted, that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by Order in Council, from time to time to continue, or to renew, if ex-

of that Act contained, for such time as shall be specified in such Order.

And whereas it is provided in the second paragraph of the seventeenth section of the said Act, which section is in the first part thereof, that "no " cattle shall be moved on any railway before the "twenty-fifth day of March, one thousand eight " hundred and sixty-six:"

And whereas it is expedient that the prohibition of the movement of cattle, by railway, should be continued beyond the said twenty-fifth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the power vested in Her by the said Act, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said recited provision, contained in the second paragraph of the seventeenth section of the said Act, be continued on and after the said twenty-fifth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, and that "no cattle shall be moved on "any railway" before the sixteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THEREAS it has been represented to Her Majesty, that certain contagious or infectious disorders are now prevalent among cattle, in the dominions and territories situated in Europe, belonging to His Majesty the King of the Netherlands, and that there is danger of the said disorders being introduced into this country by means of cattle from such countries or places: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that on and after the twentyeighth day of March instant, no cattle shall be imported or introduced into the United Kingdom, which shall come from, or shall have been at, any place within the aforesaid territories and dominious, situate in Europe, belonging to His Majesty the King of the Netherlands; and also that on and after the said twenty-eighth day of March instant, pired, all or any of the provisions, in the first part no cattle shall be imported or introduced into
