WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the eighth day of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, in the words and figures following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty, chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of your Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Paul, situate at Tongham, in the parish of Seale, in the county of Surrey, and in the diocese of Winchester.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said parish of Seale, and of the new parish of Saint John, Hale, some time part of the parish of Saint Andrew, Farnham, in the county and diocese aforesaid, which lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such parish and new parish respectively.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that such contiguous portions of the said parish of Seale, and of the said new parish of Saint John, Hale should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint Paul, situate at Tongham aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles Richard, Bishop of the said diocese of Winchester, as such Bishop, and with the consent of the Venerable John Sutton Utterton, Archdeacon of Surrey, and also Vicar or Incumbent of the vicarage of the parish of Saint Andrew, Farnham aforesaid, the patron, as such Archdeacon, of the perpetual curacy of the said parish of Seale, and likewise the patron, as such Vicar or Incumbent as aforesaid, of the perpetual curacy of the said new parish of Saint John, Hale (in testimony whereof they have respectively signed and sealed this representation), we humbly represent that it would in our opinion be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said parish of Seale, and of the said new parish of Saint John, Hale, which are described in the schedule hereunder

written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Paul, situate at Tongham aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Paul, Tongham,' and that the right of presentation and appointment to the church of such consolidated chapelry should belong to and be exercised by the said John Sutton Utterton, Archdeacon of Surrey, and by his successors, Archdeacons of Surrey, for ever.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to your Majesty, in your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Paul, Tongham, being:—

"All those several portions of the parish of Seale, in the county of Surrey and in the diocese of Winchester, and of the new parish of Saint John, Hale, sometime part of the parish of Saint Andrew, Farnham, in the same county and diocese, which are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Seale from the new parish of Saint John, Hale, aforesaid, at a point in the middle of the turnpike-road leading from Farnham to Guildford, at the four cross-roads called Whiteway's End, near the foot of the western end of the ridge of hills called the Hog's Back; and extending thence eastward along the middle of the said turnpike-road, for a distance of about one mile and one-third of a mile, to a point opposite to the middle of the southern end of the fence forming the western boundary of the dwelling-house and premises belonging to Messieurs Chester, of Church-row, Newington, in the said county of Surrey, Solicitors; and extending thence northward to and along the middle of the said fence, for a distance of eighty-eight yards, or thereabouts, to its junction with the fence forming the northern boundary of the said dwelling-house and premises; and extending thence eastward along the middle of the last-described fence, for a distance of eighty-three yards, or thereabouts, to its junction with the fence forming the eastern boundary of the same dwelling-house and premises; and extending thence southward along the middle of the last-described fence, for a distance of eighty-eight yards, or thereabouts, to a point in the middle of the turnpike-road aforesaid; and extending thence again eastward along the middle of the same turnpike-road, for a distance of a mile, or thereabouts, as far as the boundary dividing the said parish of Seale from the parish of Putterham, in the county and diocese aforesaid; and extending thence northward along the last-described boundary to its junction with the boundary dividing the said parish of Seale from the parish of Wanborough, in the same county and diocese; and extending thence, first westward and then northward, along the last-described boundary to its junction with the boundary dividing the said parish of Seale from the parish of Ash, in the same county and diocese; and extending thence north-westward along the last-described boundary to its junction with the boundary dividing the said parish of Seale from the parish of Aldershot, in the county of Southampton, and in the diocese of Winchester aforesaid; and extending thence
