LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1858.

Notice of Adoption of Act by Dwygyfylchi, CARNARYONSHIRE.

WHEREAS a resolution for the adoption of the Local Government Act, 1858, has been passed by the parish of Dwygyfylchi, in the county of Carnarvon, the said parish being a place with a population of less than 3,000 by the last census; and whereas it has appeared to me, that, by reason of special circumstances, it is expedient that such parish shall be allowed to adopt the said Act, I do hereby approve of such adoption, and I hereby further order that the Local Government Act, 1858, do come into force within such parish from and after the 30th day of April, 1866: and that Mr. Owen Williams, Postmaster of Penmaenmawr, act as Summoning Officer and take all such steps as may be necessary for the election of nine persons to constitute the Local Board for the said district.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House, at Wellington, the 11th day of January, 1866.

Present:

His Excellency the Governor in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly, intituled "The Customs Regulation Act, 1858," it is amongst other things enacted that if any goods enumerated or described in the Table of Prohibitions, contained in the 32nd section of the said Act, shall be imported or brought into New Zealand, then, and in every such case, such goods shall be forfeited, and shall be destroyed or disposed of as the Commissioner of Customs may direct.

And whereas in the said Table of Prohibitions of Goods absolutely prohibited to be imported, are included infected cattle, sheep, or other animals, and hides, skins, horns, hoofs, or any other part of cattle or other animals, which the Governor in
