

The Bankruptcy Act, 1861.

Notice of the Granting of Orders of Discharge.

The Bankrupts hereinafter named have had Orders of Discharge Granted or Suspended as hereinafter mentioned by the several Courts acting in prosecution of their respective Bankruptcies, and such Orders will be delivered to the Bankrupts unless an appeal be duly entered against the judgment of the Court, and notice thereof be given to the Court:—

Richard Walker, formerly of New Mills, near Stockport, in the county of Derby, but now of Amphil, in the county of Bedford, Railway Sub-Contractor, adjudicated bankrupt on the 26th day of March, 1866. An Order of Discharge was granted by the Court of Bankruptcy, London, on the 24th day of May, 1866.

James Berger and Charles Berger, of No. 9, Mincinglane, in the city of London, Colonial Brokers and Co-partners, trading under the style of James and Charles Berger and Co., adjudicated bankrupts on the 13th day of February, 1866.
